In the Name of God. I John A. Gray of the County of Halifax and State of N. Carolina
being very sick & weak of body but of a sound & disposing mind & memory doth
make constitute and ordain this to be my last Will & Testament in manner and
form as followeth VIZ. I lend unto my beloved wife Nancy during her widowhood
all my Property both real & Personal or untill my eldest Son should arrive to mature
age or untill either of my Children should marry. My Will & desire is that as all my
Children shall each arrive at the age of Twenty one years or as either of them shall
marry that they shall be entitled to receive one fifth Part of my estate both real &
Personal. I lend also unto my beloved wife Nancy my Estate for the express Pur-
-pose for to pay all my Just debts, & for raising, supporting & educating all my said
Children agreeable to their Proper Share of their incomes rising from my said estate.
My Will & desire further is that my Executrice should sell my Land lying in
Northampton County in the Occoneechee neck provided they will bring the sum of
one thousand dollars which sum of money shall be put to Interest for the benefit of
my wife & Children. My Will & desire is that my wife shall have full Power to
sell any Part of my Perishable Property to pay any of my Just debts. I also name
and appoint my beloved wife Nancy sole Executrice to this my last Will & Testament.

I William Killingsworth of the County of Hale & State of North Carolina, being in bad health but of sound mind and memory do make and ordain this my Last Will & Testament revoking all others by me heretofore made. First. It is my will and desire That all my just debts should be paid. Secondly. It is my will & desire, That my dear wife Elizabeth Killingsworth should have the whole of the Plantation whereon I now live during her natural life, then to my Son William Bradford Gilchrist Killingsworth also for all my negroes to be kept on the plantation untill
