Mind & Memory, Calling to mind the mortality of my Body and
Knowing that it is appointed for all men Once to Die, do Make
declare and appoint this my last will and Testament in manner
and form following, that is principally and first of all —

I Give and Recommend my Soul to Utterly Good who first gave it me, hoping a Christian burial for my Body, and as touching such worldly Substance, or Estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with in this ~~transitory~~ Life, I give devise, & bequeath in the following manner and form, Inprimis, my Will and desire is that after all my Just debts ~~are~~ paid by my Executors hereafter named, that ~~then~~ my beloved Wife Nancy Phillips shall have the whole and sole use of all my Estate, Real and personal, until my youngest Child arrives at the age of twenty one years - for the purpose of Raising, & Educating, all my Children - my Will is that at the time my youngest Child arrives at the age of twenty one years - my Wife shall have for and during her natural Life one third part of ~~all~~ my Lands including all sorts of improvements which can be included therein, My Will is that at the time my youngest Child arrives at the age of twenty one years, that all and every part & parcel of my Estate, Real & personal be equally divided amongst all my living Children, Sons & Daughters alike, and if any of my Children should have a Lawfull Heir or Heirs, and die, before my Division should take place, then my Will is that such Heir or Heirs, shall have and possess such Share, or part as might or lawfully be due to such of my Children so dying, had
