thankes to Givn unto me by the same and Calling to
mind the Mortality of my Body and knowing that it
is appointed for all men once to die do make and Ordaine
this my last will and Testament that is to say
Principally and first of all I give and recommend
my soul into the hands of God that gave it me
and for my Body I recommend it to the Earth to be
Buried in a Christian like & decent manner at
the Discretion of my Friends desiring Doubting but
the General Resurrection I shall yet resee the same
Again by the mighty power of God and as touching
my worldly Estate wherewithal it hath pleased
God to bless me with in this life I give & leave &
Dispose of the same in manner and form following
that is to say in the first place I leave to Mary
my deare Beloved wife the Plantation whereon I
now live together with the House & Chards &
lands Belonging therunto to her and her proper
and Mairy her self also I leave to my son my Negro
Named Wimble and his increase & lands therunto belonging
in his life also I leave to Mary my wife her boy as up the
whole creature to have at her Ressuringe during her life
also I Give and send by my selfe to my friend Micahel May
the Plantation whereon I now live and the first Child
that my Negre girl Vino bears I give to my friend May
after my wifes decease also I give and bequeath my Land
Julia May to my deare I sweep of land lying on the west
side of Charles swamp also I give Vino my Negroe girl
and the rest of her I leave to Julia May & my daughter also
I give and bequeath to my son also the rest of my

Principally and first of all I give and recommend
my soul into the Hands of God that gave it me
and for my Body I recommend it to the Earth to be
Buried in a Christian like & decent manner at
the direction of my Friends & nothing Doubting but
the General Resurrection I shall meet the same
again by the mighty Power of God and as touching
such worldly Estate wherewithal it hath pleased
God to bless me with in this life I give & leave
to my dear wife in this place I desire to pay
that is to say in the first place I desire to pay
my deare & belov'd wife the Plantation whereon
wee live together with the Houses & Richards &
Goods Belonging belonging to her and her proper
and having her life & so I send to my wife my Negroe
Named Winona and her sonnes all Richard & Peter Belonging to
her life also I send to my wife free to go as often
shee creatures to have at the Plantation abiding her life
also I give and bequeath to my friend Micahah May
the Plantation wherein I now live & all the furniture
that my Negroe girl Vina has I give to my friend ^{meagre} May
after my wife's decease also I give and bequeath my Plant-
ation May to my heirs I bequeath land lying on the west
side of Colclu swamp also the Vines and Negroe girl
and the rest of her I leave to Julian May & his承繼人 also
paying the vnyt debts and 3 eggs also the rest of my
Earth divid id in three parts those parts whereby I bequeath
to my wife during her life and the other part I give
to my daughter Julian May also I constitute and appoint
many my wife and Nathan Mayo my whole and sole
executors of this my last will and Testament and I do
hereby utterly disallow revoke and disannul and
every other Testament wills & legacies required and
executed by me in any way before this time spawnd

Will'd and Bequeathed Ratifying and Confirming that
no Other to my Last will and Testament in Witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal the Day
Day and Year above written

Proved by the Oath of Daniel Pursey who on his oath
Did say that he saw the Testam't John Williams
sign Seal Publish and Declare the same to be his last
will and Testament and that he to gether with Jane Story
& Benjamin Pippin the other Witnesses Subscribed
severally their Respective Names as Witnesses thereto
in the presence of the Testam't and at his request
whereupon the Testam't afrem entitred was duly
Ratified according to Law & on Rollion Record
to be Record ed
