weak in Body but of perfect sound Mind & memory thank be to God for it & Calling to mind the
Mortality of my Body and Knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make &
ordain this to be my Last will and Testament, first I recommend my soul to God who gave it
& my Body to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like manner & as Touching such worldly goods
wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with I give & dispose of them in manner & form following by
Him I give & bequeath unto my son Josiah Cotton to him his heirs & assigns forever all that Tractage
& Tract of Land between a Branch called Dominic & Captain Smiths Mill Swamp it being part of
the Tract of Land the I bought of William Scott & Rason Tippit, beginning in Dominic Branch
at the Crossing place where said Tippit formerly lived then along a line of marshy土as the
path goes to Josiah Kelmers Line including all the land from the said Line of marshy土as
between Dominic Kelmers Line & Captain Smiths Line together with the mill standing on said
Land also one negroe boy called Caesar one negroe man called Frank one bay & mare called
Mare & her foal & one other foal called Mark Anthony, Bridle & saddle one Bed & furniture
five head of Cows & Calves, Hove in case my son Josiah should not live to the age of twenty
one year or die without issue then a hoar that can stir my wife to desire that the said Land
Given to him be the property of my son Josiah

Him I give & bequeath unto my son Josiah Cotton to him his heirs & assigns forever my
Land & plantation in Scotland Neck, it being the Land that I bought of Richard Bonner, Called
the Islands, also one negroe boy called Abram, five cows & calves one bed & furniture & in case my
son Josiah should not live to the age of twenty one years die without issue it is my will & desire that
the Land given to him be the property of my son Josiah.

Him I give & bequeath unto my son James Cotton to him his heirs & assigns forever a part of my
Tract of Land on the Cypress Swamp, beginning at a Cypress in said Swamp a corner tree
Between William Bakers Land and mine running up the run of said swamp to the Road then
along the Road to Cahaki Swamp then down Cahaki Swamp to the first deep Branch that
runs into Cahaki at a black Gum then up the said branch by a Line of marshy土as to a
hickory in the pasture from thence by a line of marshy土as to a Stake in Bakers Line from
thence to the first station, also one negroe boy called Davy, five cows & calves one bed & furniture

Item I give & bequeath unto my son 16th mile Cotton to him his heirs & assigns forever all that marriage
& tract of Land between a Branch called Dominic & Captain Smith's Mill Swamp, it being part of
the tract of Land the I bought of William Scott & Rason Tippit, beginning in Dominic Branch
at the crossing place where said Tippit formerly lived then along a line of marshy trees as the
path goes to Josiah & Elmira Linn including all the land from the said line of marshy trees
between Dominic & Elmira Linn & Captain Smith's line together with the mill standing on said
land also one Negroe boy called Caesar the Negroe man called Hank one bay mare called her
Mare & her colt & one other colt called Hank Anthony, Bridle & saddle one Bed & furniture
five head of Cows & Calves, also in case my son 16th mile, should not live to the age of twenty
one years or die without I give them a bed in that case it is my will & desire that the said lands
given to him be the property of my son Josiah

Item I give & bequeath unto my son Josiah Cotton to him his heirs & assigns forever my
Land & plantation in Scotland Neck, it being the Land that I bought of Richard Bonner, Called
the Islands, also one Negroe boy called Abram, five cows & calves one bed & furniture & in case my
son Josiah should not live to the age of twenty one years or die without I give it to my will & desire that
the Land given to him be the property of my son 16th mile.

Item I give & bequeath unto my son James Cotton to him his heirs & assigns forever apart of my
tract of Land on the Cypress Swamp, beginning at a Cypress in said swamp a corner tree
Between William Baker Land and mine running up the run of bald swamp to the Road then
along the Road to Cahuhi swamp then down Cahuhi swamp to the first deep Branch that
spans into Cahuhi at a Black Gum then up the said branch by a line of marshy trees to a
hickory in the pasture from thence by a line of marshy trees to a Stake in Baker's line from
thence to the first station, also one Negroe boy called Harry, five cows & calves one bed & furniture
if my son James should not live to the age of twenty one years or die without I give it to my
will & desire that the afo^d Land be the property of my son John Cotton

Item I give & bequeath unto my son Robert Cotton to him his heirs & assigns forever my Land and
plantation on River in Edgcomb County it being the Land that I bought of Daniel Woodard also
one Negroe boy called Ben one Bed & furniture now in case my son Robert should not live to the
age of twenty one years or die without I give them in that case it is my will & desire that the above said

Land be the property of my sons Whitmell & Josiah & in case my son Whitmell do over shall and
I truly pray on God to be paid unto my son Josiah the sum of six hundred silver Spanish
milled dollars, whenever the said Josiah arrives to the age of twenty one years it shall be left
to his said Whitmell to the whole of the aforesaid Land

Item I give & bequeath unto my son John Cotton to him his heirs & assigns forever the Land
and plantation wherein I now live being the remaining part of the tract out of which I gave
my son Whitmell his also the remaining part of the tract on the Cypress swamp out of which
I gave my son James his also one Negroe boy called Dick one bed & furniture, now in case my son
John should not live to the age of twenty one years or die without issue then it is my will that
the aforesaid land be the property of my son James Cotton

Item I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Elizabeth Helms to her & her heirs & assigns forever
one Negroe Boy called Moses one Negroe Girl called Charity one Bed & furniture & fifty pounds
Virginia currency

Item I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Cotton to her & her heirs & assigns forever one
Negroe boy called Jack one Negroe Girl called Cynthia one Bed & furniture & fifty pounds
Virginia currency all of which both Negroe & money to be delivered to her whenever she
marry or come of age

Item I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Dorothy Cotton to her, her heirs & assigns forever one
Negroe girl called Harry one Bed & furniture

Item I give & bequeath unto my beloved wife Anna Cotton my riding horse also two
horses to use of their Negroes to work, for her & sum during her natural life in the hundred
it is my will that both be the property of my daughter Mary Cotton that same to be the property
of my son Josiah & for be the property of my son James Cotton also it is my will & desire after
my lawfull debts are paid that my wife Anna Cotton have for the purpose of Raising my small
children all my Land except that given to my son Whitmell Josiah and Robert, until my son
John Cotton arrives to the age of Twenty one Years I also find my wife for the same limited time
upon certain Cows of silver Ten down & 1/2 yearly Rents or all the profit that they may
earn & all the house hold & Kit

open & all the household & kitchen furniture and plantation utensils, it is further to be observed
that it is my will after my debts are paid that my son Whitmire have all the credits arising
from my Land & Negroes after taking out a sufficient sum for my family until he shall be
enabled to purchase to himself three Negroes of his own choice further it is my will Adam the
eldest which I have not already given away by quitclaim divided between my Daughter Dorothy
my son Jonah James Robert & John at the time that my daughter Dorothy shall marry or die
to the age of twenty one years but should my Daughter marry before the time above mentioned
it is my will that the division may take place immediately further it is my will before the
my Executor whom I shall nominate pay strict attention to the conduct of my wife and if they are
fully sensible that she is acting an imprudent part that they immediately take out of her hand
that part of the Estate that I have limited to her for a certain time & purpose in case my wife
should marry this my wife & desire that she be immediately dispossessed of the Land that shall
be left to her at my death plantation on the Cypress swamp and also that on her marriage that
it be rented out for the benefit of the Children it is also my will I desire that all the remaining
part of my Stock that I have not left to my wife be sold at the discretion of my Executors
further I authorize my Executors that should there arise any profit from the rest of the
Land given to any of my Children or from the heir of their negroes for the purpose of purchasing
Negroes for the Benefit of that Child to whom the Land or Negroes may be long & lastly I constitute
I appoint my friends Blount Joyner, Josiah Nelson & Willard Wilson to be whole & sole Executors
of this my last Will & Testament making void all other wills & testaments I declare where
I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this 10th day of August in the year of our Lord 1777
Signed sealed published & pronounced to be my last will & Testament in presence of
us Benjamin Foreman Sarah Duke Martha T. Vaser
