County in the Province of North Carolina being sick and weak  
of body but of sound mind and memory thanketh to Almighty  
God for the same. I make and Ordain this to be my last Will and  
Testament. first I do bequeath my soul into the hands of my  
Saviour Jesus Christ hoping for a full Pardon for all my  
sins at the Resurrection of the just and ready to be absolved  
buried at the Disclosure of my True death hereafter named and  
for my Estate which it hath pleased God to bless me with I  
despose as follows; My will is that my Executors sell  
that four hundred acres of land lying in Cumberland  
County in Virginia as well the negroes arriving therefrom the  
Esqually divided among my two sons Joseph Samuel and  
Stephen Butler and this tract of land that I now lie upon  
to be Equally divided between Joseph Butler and Stephen  
Butler at the Recreations of Samuel Butler and John Bass  
the Plantation or the plantation I give to my son Joseph  
and his wife plantation I give unto my son Stephen after his  
Mother deceas'd Item I give I bequeath unto my daughter  
Sarah Butler one Negro woman named ~~Letis~~<sup>Letis</sup> with  
her more or less and her heirs forever Item I send to my  
daughter Jane her life time one Negroe girl grand  
daughter of her deceased which she hath had in her possession  
and after her deceas to be Equally divided between  
the said Jane children with their issue and her heirs  
Item I send to my daughter with my daughter Anna  
Butler one Negroe woman and I may call her and  
her more or less the wife of her son; I send I give and  
bequeath unto my daughter Anna Butler one Negroe  
girl named ~~Letis~~<sup>Letis</sup> with her issue and her heirs forever  
I send I give and bequeath unto my daughter Alice Butler  
one Negroe girl named Millie with her issue and  
her heirs forever I send I give and bequeath unto my

I desire as follows; My Will and Desir is that my Speculator sell  
that four hundred acres of land lying in Cumberland  
County in Virginia - and the money arising therefrom to be  
Equally divided amongst my two sons Joseph Samuel and  
Stephen Butler, and this tract of land that I now lie upon  
to be Equally divided between Joseph Butler and Stephen.

Butler at the Discretion of Samuel Butler and John Bass  
, the Plantation or the short swamp I Give to my son Joseph  
and home Plantation Give unto my son Stephen all his  
Master Heirs, Item I Give & bequeath unto my Daughter  
Sarah Butler, a Negro woman named Estie Sixt  
hee I now leave to her and her heirs of free, Item I send to my  
Daughter Inde ~~now~~ her life time one Negroe Girl drudge  
and her Dowers which she hath now in her Possession  
and after her death to be Equally divided between  
the said Inde Butler with her heirs  
Item I send I give with my Daughter Anna  
Butler a Negroe woman to my wife her and  
her heirs to her and her heirs of free, Item I Give and  
bequeath to my daughter Anna Butler one Negroe  
girl named Mary with her bedchamber to her and  
her heirs of free, Item I give and bequeath unto my  
daughter Anna Butler one Negroe boy named James  
to her and her heirs of free, Item I Give and bequeath to my  
son Samuel Butler one Negroe man named Saml & his heirs  
heirs of free, Item I Give unto my son Joseph Butler one  
Negroe man named Tom & his heirs of free  
Item I Give and bequeath unto my son Stephen Butler one  
Negroe boy named Saml & his heirs of free  
Item I send unto my living wife Dorothy Butler during  
her life for the better supporting of my young children full

my negroes to which is not already given and all my stock  
apart from and three hds Goods, and after her death to be  
Equally divided among gett all my children then living  
to them & their friends; I also do appoint my son my wife  
Abelby Butcher and my two sons Samuel Butcher and  
Joseph Butcher & executors and executors of this my last will  
and testament Recounting all other Wills  
and Testaments by me made before made In witness  
whereof I have to this day heard and seal this 30 day of  
October 1760, Joseph Butcher <sup>and</sup> signed seal & delivered  
in presence of his witness William Waller Prob. <sup>his</sup> Brantley Beckah  
Spence

Halifax for April 1st in County 1763 when this Will was  
executed in open Court made by the Esq<sup>r</sup> and Abelby  
Butcher the executors of William Waller & Robert Brantley for  
one of the trustees of this will whereupon their executors did say  
they said Beckah Spence sign the said will and witness  
whereupon Abelby Butcher John Butcher Jr. & Butcher  
executors of the said Will now do make and record  
was duly acknowledged by taking the oath in Court and  
is now to be recorded
