To the Earth to be Duly Executed by the Executors and as to my Mortality Estate I Give and Bequeath and Dispose of the same in the following Manner I promise it is my wish and desire that all my just debts be paid out of my Estate at the Discretion of my Executors it is my will and desire that said be divided into yearly portions or division and the rest of my Estate I lend and bequeath to my loving wife Bethia Brantley during her widowhood and if she Marries my will and desire is that she should have one Negro Girl by the name of Charney and her choice of Horses out of the Flock, ten head of cattle, ten head of Hogs and the Carters Bed and Furniture to her and her Heirs forever, and the remainder of my Estate to be equally divided between my Daughter Harriet and my Daughter Sarah Brantley to them and their heirs forever and if they should die without an Heir then the Property to return to my wife Bethia Brantley, my will and desire is that my Friend Harry Apptecoker should be my sole Executor and Trustee I do make and ordain this to be my last will and Testament in writing whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this sixth Day of March eighteen hundred and three

Carroll and my Daughter Sarah Brantley, to them and their
heirs forever and if they should die without an heir than
they Prostely to return to my wife Esther Brantley, my wife
and desire is that my Friend Henry Applewhite should be
my whole sole Executor and Trustee I do make and ordain
