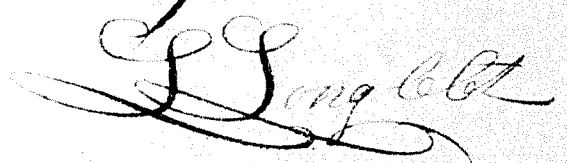

I Robert Carter of the County of Halifax & State of North Carolina being
Weak in Body tho' of Sound mind & Memory thank be to God for it knowing
the uncertainty of Human Life; do make this my last will & Testament in manner
following Viz. I give & bequeath to my loving wife Sarah Carter the Land
I now live on with all its appurtenances during her natural life & at her death I give
it to my Son Jacob Carter to him & his heirs forever all my Personal Estate of what kind
I ever I give my wife absolutely to dispose of as she thinks proper. And I do hereby
constitute and appoint my Son Robert Carter & my Son in Law Peter Tuttle Executors
of this my Last will & Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal
this 25th day of December in the year of our Lord 1797

In the Name of God amen I George Garbrough of Halifax County
State of Carolina This fourth day of March one thousand seven hundred & 48
do hereby make & declare this my last Will & Testament revoking & Disannulling
all other Wills heretofore made by me in manner & form following, to wit
I commend my Soul into the hands of Almighty God, praying for his Mercies through
the merits of my blessed Saviour Jesus Christ and my body to be buried at the
discretion of my Executors hereafter named: I then stand unto my wife
Elizabeth Garbrough my plantation & all my Lands & all the residue of my
Estate Except what I shall hereafter Give away during her natural life or lives
then I give unto my Daughter Mary Garbrough five Shillings my will & bequeath
when she marries that Robert & A
