County & State of North Carolina being of sound & perfect
Mind and Memory, do this second day of October in the
Year of our Lord Eighteen Hundred & one, make and
Publish this my last Will & Testament in manner following
that

that is to say, first it is my will and Desire that my Executors
hereafter named sell & Dispose of all my Stock of Goods and
Horse & such other part of my Property as my Beloved Wife
Rebekah Marshall may think proper to have sold, in the
Most advantageous manner that they may think Proper - and
the Money arising from the sales thereof together with all Money
received on account of Debts due me on Notes, & Book accounts
to be apply'd to the payment of my Just Debts - the residue
of the Money remaining after my Debts are paid (should there
be any) I Give to my Beloved Wife Rebekah Marshall
I also give and bequeath unto my Dearly Beloved Wife
Rebekah Marshall (after my Just debts are paid) The whole of
My Property both Real and Personal to Her and Her Heirs
forever - Secondly, I nominate & appoint Allen Marshall &
Lipe Rhymes Executors to this my will & Give to each of
them, as a compensation for their Trouble in settling
my Estate, one Hundred Dollars Each, In Witness whereof
I the said Sterling Marshall hath hereunto set my Hand
and Seal the day & year above written. —
