In the name of God amen, I Thomas Crowell of the County of Halifax
State of North Carolina do this sixteenth day of May One thousand Seven hundred & ninety three
make my last will in the following manner. To wit I give unto my Wife Mary
Crowell the following Negroes vizt Old Jenny Daniel, Luke & Mary, also one Chest of Drawers
looking glass one Dressing Table, One Bed & furniture, One bridle & Saddle, which last mentioned
property I received by her at our marriage to her & her heirs forever. Item I send unto my Mother
during her life the following Negroes Jacob & Prince, also my bay horse called dumpling, three four
lively sheats, forty barrels of corn & one Cart & wheels. Item. All the remainder of my Estate I give &
bequeath to the Child my Wife is now pregnant with, as also the property that I have heretofore
to my Mother, after my debts are paid, provided it shall live to arrive at the Age of twenty one, or shall
marry, but if the said Child, should not live to the Age of twenty one, or die before it Marries that then
I give all the said residuum, as also, the property I have lent my Mother, which property she is to
enjoy as long as she lives, to be equally divided between my brothers & Sisters vizt, Samuel, Benjamin
Edward, Sarah, Mary & Martha to them, their heirs & Assigns forever. I appoint my brothers Samuel
Crowell & Edward Crowell Executors of this my last Will & Testament. & I do hereby Authorizing
my Executors or either of them, to dispose of any part of the property therein bequeathed to the Child my
Wife is pregnant with, that they may think necessary for its support, or Education. In Witness
