In the Name of God Amen the 10th day of February 1796 I Thomas Howell of Halifax
County in the State of North Carolina being tho weak in body yet of sound & perfect memory
Halling to mind the mortality of my Body & knowing that it appertained all maner to die & make
contain this my last will & testament in manner & form following that is to say I give & command
My soul to the hand of almighty God who gave it & my Body to the earth to be buried in a Christian
manner at the discretion of my executors in such ministrations of burialing but at the general Resurrection
I shall receive the same by the wright power of God & as touching such worldly estate as I hath pte
the Almighty God to Blef me I give & dispose of the same in the manner & form following
Imprimis I give & bequeath to my son Matthew Howell to him & his heirs forever my two Negroes
David & King: Item I give & bequeath to my son in law James Ward to him & his heirs forever
two Negroe fellows Dick & Tom: Item I leave to my Grandson William Skinner the Land I
bought of Thomas Banks as will appear by deed from said Banks one feather bed & furniture
my Young barrel more also my negroe boy Dick my Negroe woman Lellie also my two Negroes
Says & But to him & his heirs it is, lawfully begotten of his body with all their future increase of the
said Skinner the Mothsut Office lawfully begotten her my desire is that what I leave him may be
Equally divided among all my Children.

Item I give & bequeath to my Daughter Patience Paine her & her heirs Twenty Shillings
Item I give to my Daughter Jane But her to her & her heirs Twenty Shillings
Item I give & bequeath to Eliza Pitman who married my Daughter Sarah Howell the sum of
Ten Shillings. Item I give & bequeath to my son Matthew Howell & James Ward each one
Bed & furniture. Item I give & bequeath the Balance or remainder of my Estate not before
given away to be equally divided among my before mentioned Children & my Grandson Nathaniel
to them & their heirs forever & lastly I do hereby constitute & appoint my son Matthew Howell
& James Ward my whole & sole Executrix of this my last will & Testament. In witness whereof
