shall arise hereafter I do make and ordain this to be my last  
will and Testament first of all I give & Bequeath my soul in the  
hands of almighty god who was the giver of it and my body to be  
Buried after a Christian like manner which I shall leave to the  
discretion of my Executor and Ex. her after mention and also what  
Worldly goods it shall please the Lord to bless me with I give and  
Bequeath in manner and for following - Inspiring I give and  
Bequeath to my son Ward Pitts Three hundred and Twenty  
Acres of purchase Patent land lying on the south side of  
Conway Creek and one Negro called Bobb & one ~~to~~ Ball faced  
mare that he has in possession and one feather Bedd ~~and~~  
Furniture that as he now lies upon said Acre Cows and Calves  
and very White and <sup>now</sup> Black and all my Carpenteres and  
Copers Tools & ten pounds to be paid in gold or silver all to him  
of his heirs friends — Item I give and Bequeath to my son small  
Pitts four hundred acres of land joining my son Ward Pitts land  
and two Negroes the one named Sam and the other named  
Philis and one feather Bedd and Furniture and one  
Blaze faced mare that is called his & Lord cows and calves  
and ten pounds to be paid in gold or silver all to him and his  
heirs for ever — Item I give and Bequeath to my son Lewis  
Pitts three hundred and nine acres of land Beginning  
in the middle of the ~~lower~~ line Belinda running over  
and Conway Creek then running <sup>south</sup> straight to the upper  
line as aforesaid containing the aforesaid three hundred and  
nine Acres joining to Conway Creek and I give him one  
Negro ~~old~~ called Tom and Twenty pounds pockt  
Money and also ten pounds to be paid in gold or sil-  
ver to him and his heirs for ever

Execution of my Will and Test. Here after mention and as for what  
worldly goods it shall please the Lord to bless me with I give and  
Bequeath in manner and for following- Inprimis I give and  
Bequeath to my son Thad Pitts three hundred and Twenty  
Acres of purchase Patent land lying on the south side of  
Conway Creek and one Negro called Bobbo & one ~~to~~ Black faced  
man that he has in possession and one feather Bedd with  
Furniture that as he who lies upon said Bedd cows and Calves  
and any Sheep and <sup>one</sup> Cattell and all my Carpenteres and  
Copers Tools & ten pounds to be paid in gold or silver all to him  
& his heirs forever — Item I give and Bequeath to my son mark  
Pitts four hundred acres of Land joining my son Thad Pitts land  
and two Negros the one named Sam and the other named  
Philis and one feather Bedd and Furniture and one  
Black faced man that is called his & his cows and calves  
and ten pounds to be paid in gold or silver all to him and his  
heirs for ever — Item I give and Bequeath to my son Lewis  
Pitts three hundred and nine Acres of land Beginning  
in the middle of the River line Belween <sup>the</sup> Conwy  
and Conway Creek then running straight to the upper  
line & unto Conwy the aforesaid three hundred and  
nine Acres joining to Conway Creek and I give him one  
Negro ~~to~~ Called Tom and Twenty pounds pockt  
Money and also Ten pounds to be paid in gold or sil-  
ver to him and his heirs forever &

Item I give and Bequeath to my son Henry Pitts the  
remaining part of that tract of Land that I have  
given to my son Lewis Pitts also I give him one  
Negro one Called Celia the other fracthel also  
I give him Ten pounds pockt & Ten pounds to  
be paid in gold and Silver all to him and his heirs  
Item I give and Bequeath to my son Thad Pitts one  
Negro Called Ben and my still but not that if I shall die

marked or not hired out until he shall arrive to years to  
choose a guardian and also I give him ten pounds to be  
paid in Gold or Silver all to his heirs for ever —  
Item I give and Bequeath to my daughter Farmer Pitts  
One Negro called Lidd one Called old Lidd and the  
other Called Young Lidd and my Womel having Bridle and  
one side Saddle and Bridle and ten pounds to be paid  
in gold or silver and one feather Bed that is called  
hus and also Two Cows & calves to her and her heirs from  
Item I give and Bequeath to my Daughter Celia Pitts  
Two Negroes the one Called adgy the other Call'd Ind and  
one Black mare and one side Saddle and Bridle and  
one feather Bed & furniture and Two Cows & calves  
and ten pounds to be paid in gold or Silver all to her  
and her heirs for ever —

Item I give and Bequeath to my Daughter Celia Pitts  
Two Negroes the one Called Littis and the other Called Anna  
and ten pounds per year money and also ten pounds  
to be paid in gold or silver all to her and her heirs for ever —  
Item I give and Bequeath to my Daughter Barbara Pitts  
One Negroe Called Barbary and also ten pounds to be paid  
in gold or silver all to her and her heirs for ever —  
Item I give and Bequeath to the child that my wife bears  
with her one Negroe Called Beck and also ten pounds to be  
paid in gold or silver all to it its heirs and assigns forever  
Item I ~~do~~ lend to my most Beloved wife Martha Pitts  
the name Plantation whereon we now live also I lend her my  
negroes Amey and Jenny and Jack and man during her  
life and also I lend her my slaves Tip and Badlam Burroughs  
and as for the rest of my estate which I have not given away  
I give to her to her own disposal now after the marriage &  
Death of my beloved wife Martha Pitts what I have left  
her I leave it to be divided between her three children —

Now if my wife should be delivered of a son he shall  
have half of the manor or plantation with

heirs and also Two Cows & calves to her and her neyfren  
Item I give and Bequeath to my Daughter Celia Pitts  
Two Negroes the one called Abby the other called Ned  
one Black mare and one side Saddle and Bridle and  
one leather Bed & furniture and Two cows & calves  
and Ten pounds to be paid in <sup>and</sup> gold or silver all the  
and her heirs forever —

Item I give and Bequeath to my Daughter Celia Pitts  
Two Negroes the one called Lilia and the other called Mean-  
ie and Ten pounds per year money and also Ten pounds  
to be paid in gold or silver all to her and her heirs forever  
Item I give and Bequeath to my Daughter Patrica Pitts  
One Negroe called Barbary and also Ten pounds to be paid  
in gold or silver all to her and her heirs ~~from time to come~~ —

Item I give and Bequeath to the child that my wife goes  
with Two one Negroe called Beck and also Ten pounds to be  
paid in gold or silver all to it its heirs and assigns forever  
Item I ~~do~~ lend to my Beloved wife Martha Pitts  
the manor Plantation whereon we now live also I lend her my  
negroes Amey and James and Jack and man during her  
life and also I lend her my Negroes Tip and Badlam During her widow-  
hood and as for the rest of my Estate which I have not given away  
I give to her to her own Repetical now after the marriage of  
Death of my Beloved wife Martha Pitts what I have left  
her I leave it to be divided Between her three children —

Now if my wife should be delivered of a son he ~~shall~~  
shall have one half of the manor or Plantation with  
his Brother Dr. Pitts But if a Daughter only to her  
her part of the other Estate lent to my Beloved wife  
and I do not my will desire that any of my Estate  
should be sold But that my Daughter Pitts Should keep  
out of it by my self and her self and that <sup>she</sup> should every  
particular Childs right to gether with out selling it for  
them until they shall come of age to take it to them selves

and I do appoint Wilson Williams to have the care  
and management of my son Henry Pitts and all his  
estate untill he shall arrive to the age of Twenty one years  
and I do further make constitute and appoint my  
Beloved wife Martha Pitts my Executrix and my  
son Hard Pitts my Exr<sup>r</sup> of this my last will and Testa-  
ment in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand  
and seal this tenth day of February one thousand seven  
hundred and seventy
