Memory thanks be to almighty God and calling to remembrance the
uncertain estate of this transitory life and that all flesh must yield
to death when it shall please God to call to make constitute and array
and declare this my last will and Testament in manner and form
following Reciting and avowing by these presents all and every
Testament and Testaments Will and Wills here to fore by me
made and declared either by word or writing and this is taken
only for my last will and Testament made this 11th day of January
in the year of our Lord Jesus Christ and dying from the bottom of my heart
for my son Past. Will Humblye giving thanks for the Grace
I give and command my Soul into the hands of almighty
God my Savior and Redeemer in Whom and by the merits
of Jesus Christ I trust and believe assuredly to be saved
and to have full Remission of all my sins and that my
Soul with my body at a General Day of Resurrection
Shall rise again with Joy and triumph over the merits of
Christ's Death and Passion Passes and inherit the Kingdom
of Heaven prepared for his elect and chosen and my body
to be buried in such a place where it shall please the
Executors here after named to appoint and now in the settling
of my temporal Estate and such Goods & Chattels as all
debt's notwithstanding I thank God for above my deserts to bestow
upon me. I do Prod or Girl and Disposeth the same in manner
and form following that is to say first I will that all those
debts and dues as I owe in Right of Conscience to any
manner of Person or Persons whatsoever shall be paid
and truly. Contented and satisfied without convenient loss.

after my decease by my Executors here after named I thin I
Give unto my beloved wife the whole and sole use and benefit
of all my Lands / and Premises Goods and Chattels during
her Willow bird, I thin I Give unto my son John Cox only
Manner Plantation where on I now do live together with the
Lands as followeth Beginning at a Red Oak on the back
line running by a little mark'd East Cane to the Sun
Spring Branch & down the Branch to Rockey Swamp
from thence down Rockey Swamp the various Courses of
the said Swamp till Opposite against my Line line on the
East side of the said Swamp including all the Lands now
possess'd on the East ~~of~~ side of the said Swamp and bound
as will appear of Record &c. to him & his heirs for ever,
and also I thin I Give to my son John Cox my Negroe Harry James
and Daniel to him and his Heirs for ever.

I thin I Give to my Son Presby Cox the Land
as followeth Bounded by a line of marked trees
Beginning a Red Oak the Back line from thence by
the said line mark'd East Cane to the Sun Spring
Branch thence down the said Branch to Rockey Swamp
thence down the said Swamp to Smiths Branch from
thence up Smiths Branch by my established line
Beginning to him and his heirs for ever and also
I thin I Give to my son Presby Cox my Negroe.

Droll and my Negroe Harry etc to him and his heirs
for ever and also I Give to my son Presby Cox the
priviledge and benefit of one third of my Orchard
and during the term of Seven Years Provided here
that he shall find proportionable part of assistance
in securing the Liquid &c. and as for my Negroe
which well I do And or Give and I chose in the manner
following that is to say at the death of my beloved wife
she to the Gold and the Money as aforesaid to be equally
Divided amongst my three Children Mr. John Cox

frome thence down rocky swamp the waters courses of
the said swamp till opposite against my Lure line on the
East side of the said swamp including all the lands there
possess in the East ~~of~~ side of the said swamp and bound
as will appear of Record &c. to him & his heirs for ever,
and also I give to my son John my Negroe boy James
and Daniel to him and his heirs for ever
I him I give to my son ^{John or} Presley of the Island
as followeth bounded by a line up marked trees
Beginning at Red Oak the Bar. line from thence by
the said line marked East and to the Barn Spring ^{up}
Branch thence down the said Branch to rocky swamp
thence down the said swamp to Smiths Branch from
thence up Smiths Branch by my established line
Beginning to him and his heirs for ever and also
I him I give to my son Presley of my Negroe.
Moll and my Negroe boy All to him and his heirs
for ever and also I give to my son Presley of the
jurisdiction and benefit of one third of my Orchard
and during the term of Seven Years Provided here
that he shall find proportionable part of assistance
in securing the Liquid &c. and as for my Negroe
which well I do And so give and I suppose in the manner
following that is to say at the death of my dears wife
The to the said and the property as widow to be equally
Divided amongst my three Children vizt John Cox
Sarah Street and Presley Cox and in case the said
woman should have a child before the time of the said
Division I give the property of her first born from
this time forward to my son John Cox and in case she
should have more than one child that all over one
be equally Divided between my two sons and also
my will affixed in Presley swamp to be equally divided
~~amongst~~ my two Sons Reserving always Open

Shant to have his Grain Ground sole free during
the time of the Mill Continuing in the Name & Prop
Cox. &c

Item I give unto Nancy Shant a Child now living with
me the sum of four pounds Cash or credit in
and lastly of all as for these Goods and Chattels and have
not made Partition by this my last will and Testament
I desire they should be equally divided between my two sons
John & Presby

I do heretofore appoint my loving wife Mary Cox and my
son John Cox and Presby Cox my whole & sole Exec
of this my last will & Testament in witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and
Year afre written
