In the Name of God Amen I William Daniel of Halifax County
in the State of North Carolina being weak of Body but of sound mind
and memory thanks be to almighty God for the same calling to mind the
perillability of the Body and that is appointed once for man to die do make
and Ordain this my last will and Testament First of all and chiefly
I bequeath my soul into the hands of my redeemer Jesus Christ through whom
merits alone I hope for eternal salvation and my Body to a decent burial
at the discretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned and for my worldly
Estate which God has graciously given me I dispose of it in manner &
form following—
Item I give to my daughter Winnie ten five Shillings Lawfull
money of England besides what she has already rec'd. ~~no more~~ of my Estate—
Item I give to my daughter Peter Saxon one Negro girl named Cloy besides what
she has already rec'd. to her and her heirs forever—
Item I give unto my son-in-law
Calise Cray five Shillings Lawfull money of England besides what he has
already rec'd. & no more of my Estate—
Item I give to my son Lewis Daniel five
Shillings Lawfull money of England besides what he has already rec'd. & no more of my Est.
Item I give unto my daughter Frances Knight five Shillings Lawfull money of
England besides what she has already rec'd. & no more of my Estate but I send
to my daughter Frances Knight one Negro girl named Sakey as long as she
lives and after decease my desire is for Sakey and her increase to be equally
divided Among her Children—
Item I give and bequeath to my son Archibald
Daniel the Plantation whereon he now lives and all the Lands on the south
side of Burncoat Swamp and one Negro boy named Sam to him & his heirs
forever—
Item I give and bequeath to my son Willie Daniel the mill field
and all Land belonging to it beginning at his own corner the corner of

Three white Oaks thence running down the mill branch to the mouth thence
thence down Brunswick and thence round the various courses of the said
Land to the beginning and one Negro boy named Jerry to him and his
heirs forever — I am I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Daniel
one Negro woman & child named Doll & Robert to one fourth part of furniture
to her and her heirs forever — I am I give and bequeath to my daughter
Jettie Daniel one Negro woman & child named Bob & Mary and one bed
& furniture to her and her heirs forever — I am I give and bequeath to my
son William Daniel & Drury Daniel the manor plantation and all the
Land thereunto belonging that which I have not already ^{given} also one tract of
Land lying in Granville County to be equally divided when they both arrive
to full age to them & their heirs forever and also give to my son
William Daniel one Negro boy named Jacob & to my son Drury Daniel
one Negro boy named Stephen to them and their heirs forever —
I am I give and bequeath to my Grandson Arthur Crif one Negro boy named
Eaton to him & the heirs lawfully begotten and I give to my Grandson John
Masper twenty five pounds Virginia money to be raised out of my Estate to
him & his heirs lawfully begotten — My will further is that if either or both
of my Grandsons Arthur Crif or Masper should die without a lawfull heir
that the Legacies which I have already them be equally divided among my
children hereafter mentioned — My will further is that at my death all
my Estate which I have not already given be equally divided amongst
my four sons & three daughters but it must be divided into eight parts

and one part I give to Frances Wrights children to be equally divided
 amongst them all I Arch dald Danies Miller, William Drury Danial Ritten
 Saxon, Elizabeth Danies & Pelly Danies and lastly I do nominate and
 appoint my sons Archibald Danial & Willie Danial my Executors of this
 my last will and Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my
 hand and fixed my seal this 6th day of July 1796—
