

William Hardin deceased

State of Carolina
Halifax County, Wednesday about three o'clock P.M. the 30th March 1791
Matthew Howell and John Lowe, being first sworn, on the Holy Evangelist of Almighty God
deposeth and saith, that William Hardin departed this life about five o'clock in the
afternoon, and a short time before his death, being perfectly in his senses, & very weak
of a dispensing mind and memory, Verbally bequeathed his property as followeth: He gave
to his sister Mary Hardin the Cow & Yearling. To his brother John Hardin he gave the Negro
boy named Joe. The Hogs left to James Barnes: Some Corn, some Working-tools, & some
Money to his Sister Elizabeth Hardin. He gave his gray mare to his Sister Nelly Hardin
He gave one Negro woman named Carter and her bed. And to John Lowe he gave two
pounds. The rest of his Estate not given away, said William Hardin desired might be equally
divided between Elizabeth Hardin widow of James Hardin dec'd, his sister Mary Elizabeth
Kelly, & his brother John - Sworn to before me, & John Lewis in the presence and County
the day and year above written -
