December in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred ninety nine make & publish this my last will &
Testament in manner following, that is to say: First my will & Desire is that my Executors
sell all my Land to the best advantage, & with the money arising therefrom, to pay all my just debts
the rest if any to return to my estate hereafter to be given away & by these bequests I am desirous
to make her bequest full to my said Land. Then all the rest of my estate I send to my beloved wife
Eleanor Moran enduring her natural life or widowhood, to move & carry to any part of the good & for her support
then I give to my son Basil Moran five Shillings to him & his heirs forever. Then I give to my son Samuel
Moran, five Shillings to him & his heirs forever, Then I give to my son Elizabeth Moran five
Shillings to him & his heirs forever, Then I give to my son Joseph Moran five Shillings to him & his
heirs forever. Then after the death of my wife I give my Daughter Elizabeth Moran one piece of her bed
& furniture to her & her heirs forever. Then after the death of my wife I give to my Daughter Sarah Moran
one piece of her bed & furniture to her & her heirs forever. Then I give to my Daughter Eleanor Moran after
the death of my wife one piece of her bed & furniture to her & her heirs forever
Then I give to my Daughter Susanna Moran after the death of my wife one piece of her bed &
furniture to her & her heirs forever. Then my will & desire is that after the death of my beloved wife
Eleanor Moran the part of my Estate in Valleys Green & every shall be equally divided
between William Moran Gabriel Moran John Moran Mary Moran Elizabeth Moran, Sarah
Moran Eleanor Moran Susanna Moran to them & their heirs forever

In the Name of God Amen I John Everett of the State of North Carolina being at present in sound mind & memory than to be to God for the same, But calling to mind the mortality of man & that it is appointed for man once to die do this thirteenth day of October one Thousand Seven Hundred & ninety five make & ordain this to be my last will & Testament in manner following: I am I send to my loving wife Hannah Everett one third of my Land & a negro fellow named Daniel & a negro woman named Esther & an equal share with my children in Stock & all House hold furniture & after her share to be divided in four parts one fourth to my Son John Everett one fourth to my Son David Everett, one fourth to my daughter Melley Everett & one fourth to my Daughter Nancy Children: I am I give & bequeath to my son John Everett, all my Land lying on the south side of Brecker's Swamp & a negro woman named Polly & a negro fellow named Peter & a negro Girl named named Kate & a negro fellow named Stephen in dispute being at law for said fellow with Samuel Pitman or to whatever is recovered in money, I am I give & bequeath to my son David Everett, all my Land lying on the north side of Brecker's Swamp & a Molatto fellow named Spencer & a negro Boy named Isaac & a negro Girl named Anne. I am I send to my daughter Melley a negro Girl named Winny & a negro Boy named Samudering his life after her death to the heirs of her body lawfully begotten; I am I give & bequeath to my
