

Wm. Noblin 102

In the Name of God Amen I William Noblin of Halifax County State of South Carolina being sick of Body but of sound sense and memory do declare this my last will & Testament as follows I Bequeath my Soul to God that gave it & my Body to the Earth to be decently buried according to the discretion of my Executors hereafter named & for what worldly Estate whithersoever God has entrusted me with I give devise & bequeath in manner as followeth
1st I will that all my Lawfull debts and funeral Charges be first paid
2nd I give forty Shillings to each of my Children namely Ann, Christopher, Lucy, William & Mary Noblin to them and their heirs forever
3rd I give & bequeath unto my loving wife Lucy Noblin my land & plantation where I now live also all my negroes & all my Estate consisting of every kind whatsoever to her & her heirs forever
4th I appoint my loving wife Lucy Noblin Executor & Robert Barrow Esq^r of this my last will and Testament revoking all former will heretofore made by me In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 11th day of Jan^y 1796
Signed sealed published & declared to be the last will & Testament of the Testator in presence of Thos. Hays John Champion Peter Bird & Wmth H. Noblin

Halifax County Jt. February 8th 1796 then this will was exhibited in Open Court and duly proved by the oath of John Champion one of the subscribing witnesses thereunto and on Motion Ordered to be Recorded; whereupon Lucy Noblin the Executrix therein named came in and was duly qualified to the same
