unto God. Therefore calling to mind the Mortality of my body do  
make & ordain this my last Will & Testament that is to say  
Principally I give & recommend my soul into the hands of God  
that Glory be, and my Body I recommend to the Earth to be  
Buried in decent Christian Burial at the Discretion of my  
executors nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection. I  
shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God;  
and as touching such worldly estate wherewithal it hath pleased  
God to Bless me in this life I give devise & dispose of  
the same in the following manner

Item I give to my friend Daughter Martha Thompson one  
Leather Bed, Bedstead & all furniture thereunto belonging together  
with one Spinning Wheel and iron pot & stocks. One Dish &  
two Plates the same being now in her brothers possession.

Item I give & Bequeath to my Son William Thompson all the  
Land & Plantation which I purchased of Charles Jolley to  
him & his heirs for ever

Item my Will & desire is that <sup>what</sup> my son Charles Thompson  
owes to Lord & Notburgh's Stores repaid out of my Estate.

Item I give to my Daughter Isannah Lee one Shilling  
Lawfull money of Great Britain & no more of my Estate.

Item I give to my Son Charles Thompson John Brooklands

Bond of eight pounds Creek due to me

Item I give to my wife <sup>longing</sup> Agnes Thompson & my Son William  
Thompson all my Estate during my wife's natural life or  
widowhood but at her death or marriage I give to my Son  
John Thompson Thirty pounds Current Money of Virginia &  
the remainder of my Estate which is not above given to be  
Equally divided amongst my other Daughters Elizabeth.

name & ordain this my last Will & Testament that is to say  
for incapsally I give & recommend my soul into the hands of God  
that gave it, and my Body I recommend to the earth to be  
Buried in decent Christian Burial at the Discretion of my

Bond of Eight Pounds Cash due to me

Item I leave to my wife Agnes Thompson & my Son William  
Thompson all my Estate during my Wife's natural life or  
Widowhood but at her death or marriage I give to my son  
John Thompson Thirty pounds Current Money of Virginia &  
the remainder of my Estate which is not above given to be  
Equally divided amongst my daughters Elizabeth,

Sarah, Lucy & Nancy,

and Lastly I do nominate & appoint my loving wife  
Agnes & my son William Executors of this my last Will &

Testament. In Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand  
& affixed my Seal the Day & Date first aforescore written —  
Signed Sealed & Declared in the presence of us — { William Riddle Street <sup>his</sup> Thompson <sup>Seal</sup>  
mark.

duly qualified according to Law & on Motion ordered to record —

to by given to almighty God from me same do make Constitute & Ordain  
this my last Will & Testament in manner & form following —  
Item I give unto my wife Hellena One hundred acres of  
Land the place I now live on & all my Mortables during the time  
of her natural life & after her decease I give the said Land to  
my son John to him his heirs & assigns for ever & desire  
that the aforesd Mortables may be equally divided among all my  
children.

Item I give & bequeath to my son Joseph One hundred & fifty  
four acres of Land it being the place called Provost to him
