Memory do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament as
follows (to wit) First I Begneth my soul to God who gave it
and my Body to the Earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my
Executors and as for my Worldly Estate I dispose thereof as follows
that is to say It is my Will and Pleasure that all my just and Legall
debts be first paid and satisfied.

I give all the Rest and Residue of my Estate both Real and Person-
al within the Colony of Virginia & Province of North Carolina
after Payment of my said debts I give and Dispose unto my
beloved Wife Francis and all my Children from and to be born
equally among them to be Divided share and share alike to
them their Heirs and Assigns for ever. Item I give and bequeath
to my said Wife all and Singular the Profits that shall arise
from my said Estate until the youngest of my Children
shall attain to the Age of Sixty four years to be Employed the
Maintaining and Education of my said Children out of the
said Profits and without being accountable for any part
thereof in any other Manner. Item I appoint my said Wife
my good Friend Joseph Montfort Esq: and William Rotam
gent^l Attorney at Law of Essex County in the Colony of
Virginia Executors of this my last Will and Testament.

said Profits and without being accountable for any part
thereof among other Expenses Item do appoint my said Wife
my Good Friend Joseph Montfort Esq^r and William Roam
Gen^t Attorney at Law of Essex County in the Colony of
Virginia Executors of this my last Will and Testament
