all my Estate debts paid, & without Sold and all my
Just debts paid and my Executors to have five pounds
Gratuity and the money that may arise from my Estate to be
disposed of as follows — The first I desire that Laurence Nobling
Son of Nancy Nobling should have at the age of nineteen
years two hundred and fifty Dollars, and the first
of the Interest of the said money to be Collected

and paid for the Support of the said Child, but thereby you provided
is paid, after that to be held with the principal till the said
Child arrives to the age of majority, but should the said Lawrence the
Widow die without a Lawfull heir then the said money to go to my
two Brothers, John and William Waller Thus the 3rd I desire my Mother
her Executors, as well to have all the Part of my Estate &c. also I
have desired Mulder to be my whole and sole Executor
