Item fourth I will and bequeath unto my dear beloved
 wife Sarah Platt a certain Negro Girl by the
 name of Harriet to have and to hold together with
 her increase if any and to dispose of in any
 manner that she may see proper

Item fifth I will and bequeath unto my dearly
 beloved wife Sarah Platt all my farming utensils
 of any description together with all my steel traps
 and guns not otherwise disposed of

5th

Item sixth I will and bequeath unto my dearly beloved
 wife Sarah Platt all my present stock of hogs

or that I may have at the time of my death together with
their increase to have and to hold the same
Item Seventh I will and bequeath that at my death
all my stock of Horses Cattle and Sheep be divided
equally in point of value between my dear beloved
wife Sarah Platt and my two daughters Mary Ann
Moody & Martha Jane

Item Eighth I will and bequeath to my daughter
Moody after the death of my dear beloved wife
Sarah three fourths in point of value of the tract
of Land upon which my dwelling including the
dwelling house mill and Orchard and the
remainings hereunto unto my daughter Martha Jane
and all my other lands lying on this tract to be
divided equally in point of value between my two
daughters Marge Ann Moody & Martha Jane

Item Ninth I will and bequeath all the other
lands lying on the other fork of the Creek to be divided
equally in point of value between my daughter
Marge Ann Moody and Martha Jane and my
Grand Daughter Sarah Frances Elvira Platt
except the tract all ready disposed of in these
third of this Will and also my Mountain lands to
be equally divided between the three Marge Ann Moody
Martha Jane and Sarah Frances Elvira at the
death of my dear beloved wife she first to have a
life estate on the same

Item Tenth I will and bequeath unto my daughter
Martha Jane all the tract of Land lying on
Richland Creek containing fifty acres known
as the Place upon which my son Miles resides
