 the Plantation where I now live I allow to my eldest son
 John also my Bay Horse and my saddle also I allow
 my son James the tract of Land I bought from Daniel
 Woodfin also all the money I now hold in possession
 and be the wear what money I have owing to me for
 it go to the discharge the demands the State holds ag-
 -ainst me for said tract of land also my Oxle gun
 and one saddle also my crop of Grain also I allow
 to my three Daughters Sally Rebecca and Jane
 all my House hold Furniture and as for the balance
 of my horse cattle hogs and sheep I want them
 divided between Nancy Sally Rebecca and Jane
 to the remnant of what I give my daughter Abigail
 and the remainder if my son Abigail to have an equal
 share with all the rest and also I allow my Daughter Elizabeth
 Griddle one dollar Also all my Farming tools I allow
 divided between my two sons And for this to be my last
 Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set
 my hand and seal this fourteenth day of July and Thirteen
 eight hundred and thirty five signed in presence of us

 I George Hall of the County of Haywood and State of
 North Carolina being in a low state of health and feeling
 the frailty of my body and knowing that I must
 shortly surrender my body to the dust and my soul
 to God who gave it, but being in perfect mind &
 memory (Blessed be God) do this 2nd day of June one
 thousand eight hundred & thirty five make & publish
 this my last Will and Testament in manner following
 I.E. First I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth
 all my estate both real and personal with everything fur-
 taining unto them to have for me and support during her
 widowhood provided that nothing herein shall be construed
 as to authorize her to make a transfer of any of the lands
 or other property to the use of any other person unless it
 should be deemed necessary to make a sale of some when
 she concludes she has more on hands than necessary for her
 keeping then to be sold at public Vendue and the first money
 collected to go the use of my daughters before as to make
 each of them one hundred Dollars counting in their receipts
 which they have received heretofore and at the marriage or
 death of my wife I further direct my executors to sell in
 some way distribute all my remaining property (after
 all legal demands against my estate is satisfied) among
 my heirs as to make them all equal counting in their
 the Daughters up to one hundred Dollars each and the sons
 two hundred each and all share equal after that sum is
 made up to them
 And do hereby order my worthy friends John Hall &
 William Clark Jr. as executors of this my last Will &
 Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
 signed in the presence of
