Last Will Testament of George Cathey

State of North Carolina Haywood County I will and bequeath my self and Soul to God who gave it, and I further bequeath my property to the following Wives and Persons (viz)
My self and Heiress to be sold, and the price of them with what Debts are due to me to be applied to the Discharge of my Debts, or so much of it as will pay all I owe — and to my wife Sarah Will and bequeath my Land, and other Property to her use for maintaining of the children now living with her, and for all their use and Support during her life or widowhood; Except one Year old Mair Coult, which I will to my Son Spencer Cathey to have her when he arrives at the age of Twenty one years as a reward for Ten Dollars of money paid me by said Spencer for said Coult heretofore, and I further Will that when my youngest Child comes of age, that my wife Sarah shall then divide all my Land, and property Equally among all my Children — Observing to deduct what may have

have been given to those who have already married may marry or live home and receive any portion from their Shares of said Estate, reserving to herself a competency for her own Support during her own life or widowhood; and at the end of her widowhood or life all to be Equally Divided amongst said Children — This I make as my last Will and Testament before God, and man I hereunto set my hand and seal this 2nd of June one Thousand eight hundred and Twenty eight
