

Item tenth I Will my son John James Patton Five dollars

Item Eleventh I Will and bequeath to my daughter Jincy Patton one Negro girl named Lusa Daughter of Dina also my saddle mrs. Polly Morgan, and two beds and furniture also one cow and calf besides her stock she already has Twelfth I Will and bequeath to my daughter Sophia P. one Negro girl Harriet and Mrs. Pigeon and one cow and calf besides her stock now here and two beds and furniture.

Thirteenth I will and bequeath to my daughter Mary Patton one Negro girl named Jane one filly Buckingham one cow and Calf, besides her other stock now here, two beds and furniture. I also will to my three daughters Jincy Sophia & Mary jointly my Woods tract of Land of fifty acres so long as they remaine single but if they all get married then my Will is that the said Land be sold by my executors and the proceed divided equally among all my daughters then living unless one or more of the Negros given to my daughters Jincy Sophia and Mary should die during my life time then my Will is that the proceeds of the sale of the Woods Land should go to such of my three last named daughters as shall leave a Negro by death.

Fourteenth I Will to my two sons James McConnel and Samuel P.C. Patton one other Negro boy named Joe also two beds and furniture each,

Fifteenth I Will and bequeath to my beloved wife Mary one Mrs. Del two cows and calves two beds furniture also to have the use and possession of my dwelling house and plantation during her lifetime or widow hood, I Will that my son James McConnel Patton keep my two Watch horses on the plantation for the use of the family at home

Sixteenth I appoint my son James McConnel Patton Executor of this my last Will and Testament signed published and acknowledged in the presence of the witnesses hereunto subscribed, this first day of March, in the year of our Lord 1848

I John McLean of the town of Newbern in the County of Haywood and State of North Carolina being of sound mind and disposing memory and believing that my earthly end is near at hand do make ordain establish and proclaim this and this only as my last Will and Testament in manner and form as follows

that is to say first I Will and bequeath my soul to almighty God from whence I received it and my body and my body to its mother earth from which it was taken to be buried in a decent and Christian like manner

Second I will that after all just debts are paid the remainder of my property of every description the Town lot upon which I now live all the notes and accounts which I may have on hand and a cow and every thing else should be borne by my beloved wife Deborah during her natural life or widow hood

It is my will that my beloved wife Deborah shall be Executor of this my last Will and Testament

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal on this the 28th day of May in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and fifty six
