knowing the uncertainty of life and certainty of death
do make and publish this my last will and testament
(as follows)

Item 1st I will that after my death my body be
decently and in a manner becoming laid buried

Item 2nd I will also becometh that out of my estate
all just debts be paid off and discharged and my
rights after named executors, who which I will
and becometh let by real and personal property
of every description whatsoever to my dearly beloved
wife Margaret Browning during her natural life
or widowhood and then at her death her marriage or
death the same to go to my infant daughter

Mary E Browning who should my executors being
again I desire my executors to take charge of
said property and to hold the same except
it be so be that the rights as they may claim but
for the use of my infant daughter and to pay
Item 3rd I do hereby appoint my much beloved
friends Walter Brown and George Brown my
executors to this my last will and testament

publish and declare this to be my last Will and
testament; hereby revoking and making void
null and void former last Wills and testaments
and writings in the nature of last Wills and
testament by me heretofore made

My Will is first that my funeral charges
and just debts shall be paid by my Executors
hereinafter named

The residue of my estate and property which
shall not be required for the payment
of my just debts funeral charges and
the expenses attending the execution of this
my last Will; and the administration of my
estate, I give devise and dispose thereof as follows
to wit - I give and devise to my beloved wife
Polly Ann Edmonston all my real and
Personal property of any kind whatsoever
which I may possess at the time of my death
to have and to hold the same during her
natural life, and at the death of my
beloved wife Polly Ann Edmonston

It is my Will that all my real estate be equally
divided between my two sons Basil Bush
Edmonston and Thomas Benton Edmonston
whichever division may be made as my two sons
may think proper. It is my Will however that
my two sons pay to my three daughters (to wit -)
Laura G. Allen Dorothy Independence Himes
and Nancy Adaline Allen the sum of
one hundred dollars each to be paid within
years after the decease of their mother and
should I fail to give my daughter Nancy
G. Allen a horse before my death, then
my executors shall give her a horse worth

one hundred and twenty dollars or cash
to that amount soon after my death
should either of my sons before named die
without issue then my other son shall have
all my real estate by his paying the
additional sum of fifty dollars

to each of my three daughters before named
within twelve months after the decease of
his brother

And I do nominate and appoint my two
sons Basil Booth Edmonstone and Thomas
Benton Edmonstone to be the Executors of this
my last Will and testament

In testimony whereof I the said
Edmonstone have here subscribed my name
and affixed my seal this the nineteenth
day of October in the year of our Lord
one thousand eight hundred and seven

all that is in the house I do further Will that
all of the remainder of my property land and
negroes and other property not named a fore
is to be sold and the proceeds from the sale is to
be equal divided unto all of my children of
both sides & Maria and Mary children unto
the exception of James he received three hundred
Dollars more than the other children heretofore

December 1864
