Item 1^o I will that after my death my body be

settled after named executors, etc. I will
leave my wife all my real and personal property
of every description whatsoever to my surviving
wife Margaret Broome during her natural life
or widowhood and then at or after her marriage or
death the same to go to my infant daughter
Margaret Broome and should my wife die
before I desire my executors to take charge of
said property and hold the same except
it to be held with the rights as they my done best
for the use of my infant daughter Margaret Broome
Item 3^o I do hereby appoint my much esteemed
friend Walter Brown of the town of Newbury
executors to this my last will and testament

the 16th day of June A.D. 1865. He

testament by me heretofore made
My will is first that my funeral charges
and just debts shall be paid by my executors
hereinafter named
The residue of my estate and property which
shall not be required for the payment
of my just debts funeral charges and
the expenses attending the execution of this
my last will, and the administration of my
estate, I give devise and dispose thereof as follows
to wit - I give and devise to my beloved wife
Dolley Ann Edmonstone all my real and
Personal property of any kind whatsoever
which I my have at the time of my death
to have and to hold the same during her
natural life, and at the death of my
beloved wife Dolley Ann Edmonstone
It is my will that all my real estate be equally
divided between my two sons Basil Bush
Edmonstone and Thomas Benton Edmonstone
what division may be made as my two sons
my think proper, It is my will however that
my two sons pay to my three daughters (to wit)
Laura C., Ellen Dorothy and Lydia Nease
and Nancy Adeline Allen the sum of
one hundred dollars each to be paid within
years after the decease of their mother and
Should I fail to give my daughter Nancy
A. Allen a home before my death, then
my executors shall give her a home worth
one hundred and twenty dollars or less
to that amount soon after my death
Should either of my sons before named die
without issue then my other son shall
All my real estate by his paying the
additional sum of fifty dollars
