my Executors immediately after my decease  
or as soon after as practicable for her comfort  
and behoof, and in as much as under the  
settlement executed at our Marriage my house and  
lot in Chatham Street was settled upon her for her  
life and from this and other sources she will prob-  
ably receive an income adequate to her support  
I do not deem it necessary to make any other pro-  
vision for her comfort or do more than confirm  
the said settlement with my blessings.  
Thirdly I give to my grand son Christian Henschel  
the son of the Rev William Henry Henschel my  
gold watch.

Fourthly I give devise and bequeath my farm near  
Flat Rock in Hendersonville County North Carolina  
and the Low Bonds public stock or shares in any  
incorporated Company I do or may possess  
with all the rest and residue of my estate real or  
personal to my Children to be equally divided among  
them share and share alike the Children of my  
deceased Child to represent their parent, and to take  
among them such share as the parent would  
have taken if alive at the time of my death.

Fifthly Upon the death of my dear wife Susan  
Rose Henschel I direct that my house and lot  
in Chatham Street shall be sold and the proceeds  
of sale to be equally divided among my Children  
share and share alike, the Children of my deceased child  
to represent their parent, and to take among them  
such share as their parent would have taken if alive  
at the time of my death.

Sixthly I nominate and appoint my three

And Thomas Sturckle Executor of the My last Will and Testament, and I do hereby give to My said Executor or those of them as shall qualify under this will full power and authority to sell mortgage or otherwise dispose of all or any portion of My Estate real or personal for the purpose of making a division of the same among My Children as above provided, or in any other ~~ways~~ <sup>ways</sup> carrying into effect the object and intentions of this will.

Finally. It is My wish and desire that all My Manuscript sermons shall be burned and that I be buried at the East end of St Pauls Church yard near the lecture here so long affiliated as the Pastor, and to whose people I am warmly attached.

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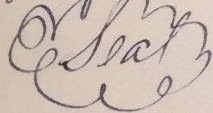
