 of John P. Corn of the County of Buncombe and State of
 North Carolina being weak in body but of a perfect mind
 and Memory Thanks be to the Lord for the same and now
 calling to mind the Mortality of my body and knowing it is
 appointed for all Men one to die do Make and Ordain this
 my last Will and Testament That is to Say Principally and first
 of all I Give and recommend my Soul unto the hand of God
 that gave it and for my body I recommend to its Mother next
 to be buried in a Christian Burial at the discretion of my Executors
 and for my such and said estate where with God has been pleased
 to bless me with in this life I Give assign and dispose of
 the same in the following Manner for as it is my Will and I do
 Ordain the first place that all my Debts and Funeral Charges
 be paid then I Give and bequeath unto Elizabeth Corn
 my Dearly beloved Wife all my whole estate both Real and
 Personal to dispose of at her discretion all my Children
 that they may all have a like in giving their part this to be during
 her life or widowhood or right reasoning But if she should
 marry then every one to receive their part them that has got
 nothing to get Equal with them that has got to Count
 what they have got as so much of their part and her the
 Elizabeth to have a Childs part in case she should marry
 again then I do constitute and Ordain my beloved wife
 and my two Sons Jesse Corn and Noah Corn my
 only Sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament
 only that my Executors are to See that each Child has their
 part as herein by disannul revoke and disallow all and
 every other former Will and Testament allowing this this
 and alone to be my last in Witness whereof I have
 here unto set my hand and Seal the day and date
 above written Signed Sealed and delivered in the presence
 of the Witnesses with the words and advised entered lined
 before aforesaid by me the aforesaid John P. Corn
