

South Carolina?

In the name of God amen;

I Macmillan B King of Charleston in the State aforesaid being of sound and disposing mind and memory do make publish and declare this to be my last will and Testament hereby Cancellling and revoking all former or other wills and Testaments by me heretofore made -

Imprimis - I order and direct all my just and lawful debts to be paid as soon after my death as convenient -

Item - In order to relieve my Executors herein - after named or such as shall qualify upon my will, of all embarrasment upon the Subject I do hereby declare that I do not regard myself as entitled to any part of the estate of my late Father, the Honorable Mitchell King, either as a devisee under his will or for commissions as Executor thereunder this declaration is made because I regard the advances made to me by my father in his life time, as a full share to me - And I do hereby renounce all or any claim upon the estate of my said Father -

Item - Whereas I am indebted to my brother G. Kirkwood King by a bond which is secured by a mortgage by me to my late father the Hon Mitchell King, of my plantation on Savannah River known as Kings Tree on Carolina, covering such bond and also another bond recently paid; And Whereas I have executed another mortgage, of a subsequent date upon my said plantation to Richard H. Corondes; And Whereas I am particularly desirous that the debt to the said Richard H. Corondes secured by such subsequent mortgage shall be fully secured and paid and yet I have no authority or right to impair the security held by my brother

G. Kirkwood King, but desire by this my last will and Testament to so dispose of my property as will fully secure to him the payment of the debt owing by me to him, and still leave the security for the payment of the debt to the said Richard^d L. Loundes an ample one;

Now with a view to this, I give and bequeath to my brother G. Kirkwood King all my silver plate, forks spoons &c now in the use of my sister Miss Susan C. King for and during such period of time as my debt to him shall remain unpaid, and with power and authority to him, if he deems it necessary, to sell the same or any part thereof and apply the proceeds towards the payment of the debt to him, this bequest to my brother G. Kirkwood King not to be in substitution of the other security held by him, but cumulative thereto; And upon the payment of my said debt to my said brother G. Kirkwood King, in case he has not executed the power of sale given to him, then I give and bequeath all of my said silver plate forks spoons &c to my sister Miss Susan C. King for and during her natural life and after her death I give and bequeath the same to my sisters Mrs Ellen M. Campbell and Mrs Louisa P. Barker or such of them as shall be living at the death of my sister Miss Susan C. King equally to be divided between them, and in case any of my said sisters be dead at that time leaving a child or children then living, then I give and bequeath the share which would have gone to such of my said sisters if then living to her child or children by representation.

Item I order and direct that my plantation

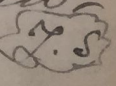
on the Savannah River and known as Kings or Carolina, shall be rented out by my Executors or such as shall qualify hereupon or by the survivor of them, during the life time of my sister Miss Susan C. King, at the highest and best possible rent which can be obtained therefor in their or his discretion, (it is now rented out at Five Thousand Dollars per annum) and the nett annual rent thereof, I order and direct to be applied in the manner and form following, that is to say: (1) I order and direct one half of such annual rent to be applied to the payment and extinguishment of my debts (2) I order and direct the other half of such annual rent to be paid to my sister Miss Susan C. King during her natural life. (3) Upon the payment and extinguishment of my debts, then I order and direct, that during the life time of my sister Miss Susan C. King, the one half of the rents ordered to be applied to their extinguishment during her life time be equally divided between my sisters Mrs Margaret C. Hugler Mrs Henrietta C. Williamson, Mrs Ellen M. Campbell and Mrs Louisa P. Barker or such of them as shall be then living and between the children then living of my brother A. Campbell King such children taking among them one share by representation as if their said father had been named among my sisters, and with distribution by survivorship among such

children during the operation
of this clause of my will. And
in case any of my said sisters
be then dead, leaving a child or
children then living or in case
any of my said sisters shall die
during the life time of my said
sister Miss Susan C. King leaving
a child or children then living
then and in either of such case,
I order and direct, that the
share which would have
gone to such sister if then
living be paid to her child or
children by representation -
(4) In case that my sister Miss
Susan C. King depart this life
before the extinguishment of my
debts, then and in such case
I order and direct that the half
of such annual rent hereinbefore
provided for her shall be
equally divided between my
sister & Mrs Margaret C. Huger
Mrs Henrietta C. Williamson
Mrs Ellen M. Campbell
and Mrs Louisa P. Barker
or such of them as shall be
then living and between
the children then living
of my brother A. Campbell
King & such children taking
among them one share by
representation, as if their
said father had been
named among my sisters
and with distribution by
survivorship among such chil-
-dren during the operation of this
clause of my will, and in
case any of my said sisters
be then dead leaving a child or

children then living then
and in such case I order
and direct that the share
which would have gone to
such sister if then living, be
paid to her child or children
by representation. (5) Upon
the extinguishment of my
debts and the death of my
sister Miss Susan C. King

I order and direct that all
my property real and personal
not specially bequeathed be sold
by my executors or such as shall
qualify hereupon or the survivor
of them and the proceeds of
sale I give and bequeath
in equal shares to my sisters
Mrs Margaret C. Huger, Mrs Henrietta
Williamson, Mrs Ellen M. Campbell
and Mrs Louisa P. Barker, or such of
them as shall be then living, and
between the children then living
of my brother A. Campbell King
such children taking among
them one share by representation
as if their said father had been
named among my sisters, and
in case any of my sisters be
then dead leaving a child or
children then living then and
in such case I give and
bequeath the share which would
have gone to such sister if then
living to her child or children
by representation. Lastly I now
= make constitute and appoint
my brother G. Kirkwood King
and my friend Wm. H. G. DeSales
executors of this my last will
and testament and I authorize
and empower them or each

of them as shall qualify hereupon
 or the survivors of them to sell and
 dispose of all or any part of my
 estate real or personal, at their
 or his discretion and to execute
 conveyances therefor: Should
 it become necessary in the judgment
 of my Executors or Executor to sell my
 Savannah River plantation during
 the life time of my sister Miss
 Susan C. King, then I order and
 direct that out of the proceeds
 of such sale my debts be first
 paid, and the balance remaining
 after such payment, I order
 and direct to be invested by
 my Executors or Executor in
 good securities with power
 to them or him to change
 the investment at discretion
 and the income arising herefrom
 to pay to my sister Miss Susan C.
 King, during her natural life
 and after her death, I give and
 bequeath the principal of the
 said investment to my sisters
 Mrs. Margaret C. Huger, Mrs. Henrietta
 Williamson, Mrs. Ellen M. Campbell
 and Mrs. Louisa P. Barker and
 the children of my brother A.
 Campbell King as directed in
 clause 5 of the next proceeding
 item of this my will -
