

I Maria A. Callodaine of the County of Henderson and State of North Carolina do make and ordain this to be my last will and testament in manner and form following to wch I will and bequeath to the said children of my Brother R. S. Blain viz Melton C. Harriet E. John W. Ella C. James C. and Eliza S. all children of the said Rufus S. Blain and his wife Maria one hundred dollars each to be paid them when they are twenty one years old by me executor who shall be hereafter named. I also will and bequeath eight hundred dollars to my sister Harriet Green to be paid her by my said executor for the use and education of her children. I also will and bequeath fifty dollars to Maria S. Calaine daughter of Leander S. Gash and I also will & bequeath fifty dollars from son of Terence Whaley. Also fifty dollars to my brother Polly O. McBlain. Also one hundred and fifty dollars I will and bequeath to Mary McAttee justice a girl held to service by me and now in the family of R. S. Blain which money is to be paid out in purchasing her a bed and all such other things as I should bound to furnish her when she shall be eighteen years old at which time her term of service expire.

I further appoint Leander S. Gash of Henderson County and State of North Carolina my executor. I do further ordain that the foregoing sums of money at interest shall remain at interest till all my just debts and bequests shall be paid out of the interest. And I also ordain that the interest of the different sums going to the children of R. S. Blain and his wife Maria be paid annually to the said Maria McBlain till such time as it may be paid to the said children severally.

shortness of life certainty of death, and being of sound
mind and disposing memory do make and ordain
this as my last will and testament and revoking
all other wills by me made prior to this date, 1st¹ S
will that my executors and Executrix herein after
named collect all debts due me and if and if they sh-
ould not be sufficient that they sell enough of my char-
-able property to pay all my just debts, I will and
bequeath unto my living wife Eliza Jane Hoots all my
property both personally and real for to enable her to
raise my children provided she lives as a widow, but
if she marries again then she shall only have her dower
in my lands which she wold have been entitled to
if no will had been made, and one years allowance
and the balance of the property to be equally divided
among my children but if she never marries, then she
shall have the use of the whole during her life time and then
the property to be divided among the children, as above directed,
the aforesaid property consists of one hundred and twelve
acres of land including the place where I now live, join-
ing Rufus Edney, Andrew Maxwell, Mr. Oliver Lewis and
two head of horses, five head of cattle, some ten or twelve
head of sheep, seventeen or eighteen head of hogs, all farming
tools one wagon, corn, fodder, Hay, Potatoes, Poultry, house hold
and Kitchen furniture, one rifle gun and one shot gun, which
I desire to be given to my two oldest Boys, the shot Gun to
Andrew and the Rifle to James, when they become of age,
I also desire my wife to have all the Rifle, wheat and Bacon
in hand as above directed, I will and appoint my loving wife
Eliza Jane Hoots, and James Bly the Executors & Executrix
to carry out the foregoing will in manner and form as the
law directs signed sealed and acknowledged this the 3rd
day of January 1864, Test Joseph Hoots.
