I Robert Russell Townsend being of sound and disposing memory and understanding; Concerning the certainty of Death, and the uncertainty of the time thereof, to the end that I may be better prepared to leave this world when it shall please my God to call me hence have now determined to direct what disposition shall be made of my property both real and personal after my decease! And after maturely Considering the circumstances of all those whom as my heirs at Law, the objects of my gratitude or affection in my judgment my estate shall be distributed - I do make publick and declare This to be my last will and Testament, hereby revoking any will that I may have heretofore made. And my will is first, that after my decease, my body shall be decently buried without ostentation or unnecessary expense, and that my funeral expenses and all my just debts shall be paid by my executor hereinafter named. And as to the remainder of my Estate and property with which God has blessed me; and shall not be required for the payment of my debts, (if any) and funeral expenses and the expenses in and about the execution of this my last will and Testament, and administration of my Estate I give demise & dispose thereof as follows: First To my son Joseph H. Townsend three tracts of Land as follows - First tract containing about 34 acres joining Lands of Tom Garner & my home place which I bought of Willim Lanning, for further descripton of the same reference is made to Deed made by Wm Lanning to $\frac{1}{2}$ dated 26th day March 1845. - Second Tract on Tyles Creek joining the above and known as the home place where I now live containing one hundred & twenty five acres more or less and for more particular descripton reference is made to doc presented to me

by Thos Murray dated Feby 11th 1824 and registered
in the Register's Office in Bumcombe in Book
No 14 on page 204 on the 16th day June 1827.—
Third Tract containing 120 acres more or less
joining the above lands described, and granted
to me by State Grant dated 22nd Sept. 1841 and
numbered 52 for further description reference is
made to said Grant registered in the Register's
Office of said County in Book No 14 Record of Deeds
on page 210 &c — Second Item I will and be-

queath to each one of my children to wit; to the
heirs of my son Lewis Greenlee Townsend and
my daughter Isabella Jane Townsend & William
S. Townsend E. W. Townsend Robert P. Townsend
and Martha A. Lanning & the heirs of Margaret C.
Jackson one dollar each to be paid by my Executor
hereinafter to be named out of my personal property
and the remainder of my personal effects of any
shall remain I will and bequeath to my son Joseph
H. Townsend — And lastly I do hereby constatale
and appoint my son Joseph H. Townsend my
lawful Executor to all in backs and purposes
to execute this my last will and Testament
according to the true intent and meaning of
the same & every part & clause thereof hereby revoking &
deleting utterly void all other wills & Testaments by me
hereto made — In witness whereof I the said Robert R.
Townsend do herein set my hand & seal this the
23rd day of August A.D 1881—

A paper writing purporting to be the last will and testament of Robt R. Townsend deceased, is exhibited before me by Joseph H. Townsend the Executor herein named, and the due execution whereof by the said Robt R. Townsend is proven by the oath and affirmation of A. L. Patterson one of the subscribing witnesses thereto, and David Stradley -

The said A. L. Patterson says, that he as one of the subscribing witnesses to said paper writing, purporting to be the last will and testament, and which bears date of the 23^d day of August 1881 - of the said Robt R. Townsend: That Robt R. Townsend in the presence of the said A. L. Patterson subscribed his name at the end of the said paper writing; That the said Robt R. Townsend the Testator aforesaid did at the time of signing his name as aforesaid declare the paper writing so subscribed by him, to be his last will and Testament, and he did thereupon subscribe his name at the end of said will as an attesting witness thereto and at the request and in the presence of the said Testator; and that M. M. Patton a subscribing witness to said will is dead.

That the said M. M. Patton at the same time of Deponents subscribing his name as an attesting witness to said will, he the said M. M. Patton, subscribed his name thereto as an attesting witness at the request and in the presence of the said Testator Robt R. Townsend.

And this Deponent further saith: That at the time when the said Testator subscribed his name to said last will and Testament as aforesaid

and at the time of the deponent A. L.
Patterson and M. M. Patton Subscribing
their names as attesting witness thereto,
as aforesaid, The said Robt R. Townsend
was of sound mind and memory;
of full age to execute a will, and was
not under any restraint to the knowledge
or information or belief of the said deponent.

And the said David Stradley ^{says:}
That the paper writing purporting to be
the last will and testament of the said
Robert R. Townsend deed, dated the 23^d
day of August 1881., was written by him
the said David Stradley, at the request
of the said Testator Robt R. Townsend
and that he the said Testator, signed
the same in the presence of the said David
Stradley and declared the same to be
his last will and testament -

Deponent further saith - That M. M.
Patton one of the subscribing witnesses
is dead - That at the time when
the Testator Robt R. Townsend Subscribed
his name to said paper writing as aforesaid
he saw the said M. M. Patton subscribe his
name as an attesting witness thereto,
at the request and in the presence
of the said Testator -

It therefore appears that said
paper writing and every part
thereof is the last will and
testament of the said Robt
R. Townsend deceased - That
the same is duly proven according
to Law - It is therefore ordered
that the said will and this
certificate be filed and the
said Joseph H. Townsend is duly
qualified as Executor by taking
the oath of office prescribed by law.
