And after my wife's decease to my daughter Elizabeth Willison William Willison one negro man named Ada and one negro boy named Ada during their Lives and then I give them to their children and lawfully begotten of her body. I give to my daughter Elizabeth Willison of the my wife's Decree one base of Drawers and Looking Glass one trunk one spill martin then after my wife Sarah's Decree I give to my son Benjamin E. Mallison one negro man named Bob & one negro boy named Luke & one bed & furniture one bureau and six chairs one pair of glass candle stands then I give and bequeath to my well beloved son Christopher D. Mallison after my wife's Decree one negro boy named Bob and one negro boy named Stephen one bed & furniture and one bow set and what furniture belongs to it one looking glass one square table one pair brass candle sticks and one knife base then after my wife's Decree I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary M. Cummer one negro boy named Tom one bed & furniture half dozen silver table spoons & half dozen teaspoons one Bure & Glass and if my negro woman Cook should have and other child I give it to my Daughter Mary M. Cummer one Lard can then after my wife's Decree I give and bequeath to my son Francis Mallison one negro boy named Jack & one negro woman named Luck one feather bed & furniture one silver saddle one Table one chair then after my wife's Decree I give and bequeath to my daughter Clarice Mallison one negro girl named Lucy half dozen silver teaspoons one pair silver sugar tongs one feather bed & furniture one Dressing Case and Looking Glass. I give all the Rest of my house hold furniture after the Decree of my wife to my son Christopher D. Mallison after the Decree of my wife Sarah Mallison my will I desire is that all my stock should be divided by two for & holders Equally between all my children.

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my will I desire is that if either my sons Christopher or my son Benjamin should die without lawfull heirs begotten by their bodies my desire is that the survivor should have the whole of my Land. Then I give to my well beloved wife Sarah Mallison all the money that is due me at the Northward but looking for my Last I nominate constitute & appoint my well beloved wife Sarah Mallison and my two sons Christopher Mallison & Francis Mallison Executors & Executors to this my last will & testament. Resolving all other will or wills hereto fore by me made & allowing this only to be my last in testamentary force. I have put my hand & affixed my seal this 30th August 1811.

In the Name of God Amen I Anne Barron of the County of Hyde State of N. Carolina being in reasonable health & sound disposing mind and memory have caused this my last will and testament to be put in writing in manner following Viz. I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Sarah Bay a negro woman named Jenny daughter of said Sarah Bay to remain with her until she is three years old at the expiration of the said three years I give the said negro girl to remain unto my Grand Daughter Ann Maria Walker to her her heirs and assigns I also give unto my daughter Sarah Bay the said one hundred Dollars she her heirs and assigns I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Archibald one hundred Dollars and one bed & furniture to her and her heirs & assigns

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I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Rebecca Brown one Dollar an more of my Estate. I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Elizabeth Tuley one hundred Dollars and one cent & p^{ts} further to her heirs and assigns. I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Pussia Walker one negro boy named York one negro girl named Poney, one hundred Dollars, and one cent & p^{ts} further to her, her heirs & assigns. I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Lois Ellison one negro man named Sam one hundred Dollars and one cent & p^{ts} further to her, her heirs & assigns. I give and bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Nancy Windley one hundred Dollars to her, her heirs and assigns. I give & bequeath unto my Grand Son Boyer B. Walker my negro boy age, and one hundred and fifty Dollars in lieu of a negro man Casor that I owned to be sold. The said negro boy and the hundred & fifty Dollars I bequeath to be the worth of Casor but if the said Boyer B. Walker should refuse and the hundred & fifty Dollars in lieu of Casor, and should bring suit against William B. Ellison in which I have agreed to sell Casor, and a Jury should be had, against William B. Ellison for more than the worth of Casor, and the hundred & fifty Dollars, which said negro boy age & the one hundred & fifty Dollars I give unto the said William B. Ellison. It is all as aforesaid, and if the sale of Casor and the hundred & fifty Dollars should not amount to the Judgment & that my will is that my Executor pay unto the said William B. Ellison the Difference out of the unwilling part of my Estate before Division is made of that part of my Estate. I give and bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Ann Tuley one negro named Vol to her, her heirs & assigns. I give unto my Grand Son John Walker fifty Dollars &c. My will is that my Executor as soon as possible after my Death pay of the Legacy and make a Division of the unwilling part of my Estate amongst my five Daughters namely Sarah Boyer Mary Archibald Elizabeth Tuley, Pussia Walker and Lois Ellison, share & share alike. My will is that I give nothing more than one dollar to my Daughter Rebecca Brown. Lastly I constitute & appoint my cousin John Thomas Walker Whole & Sole Executor of this my last will & testament.
