

In the Name of God am I Thomas Easter of
the County of Hays being sickly and have but of
perfect sound Mind and memory thanks be to
almighty god for it befalling to Mind the Mortality
of my body knowing that it is appointed one
for Men to die. I do make ordain Constitute and
appoint this to be my last will & Testament and
Testimony and Discharge of all other will. by me
made in form and manner following Viz:

1. I leave unto my wife Suckey Easter all my Land
and Negroes during her Natural life and no longer
and all the remainder of my property thus belonging
to me.
2. I will and bequeath of the my wife Suckey all my
Land unto my son John Easter and his heirs.
3. Give and bequeath unto my Daughter Abby Easter
one Negro girl Name Ruby to her and her heirs.
4. Give and bequeath one Negro woman free and
her increase unto my four youngest sons. William
Easter Quincy Easter Quincy Easter & Hilary Easter
to them and their heirs to be equally divided amongst
them all. Lastly I do appoint my wife Suckey Easter
and John Easter to my Executors to this my last will
and Testament in the Year of our Lord 1852.

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State of North Carolina I know all men by these presents
Hays County that Archibald McEnty of the County
and State aforesaid. Doth give grant and Convey unto
my beloved son and Daughter all my property real
and personal as follows. of the New farm of Saw-
dus, I give and bequeath unto my beloved son Math
the Plantation whereon I now live with all the Land to
the Eastward of Pasture Creek also the Plantation and
Land thence belonging I purchased from John Black
and Martin Thomas Adams. also one Negro boy called
Hudson. one duck. one grind stone. 1 pair fine dogs and
half of the Hatching and two feather beds with their furniture
to him and his heirs forever.

Also, I give and bequeath unto my loving Daughter
Mary the Plantation and Land all to the Eastward of
Pasture Creek whereon my Mother now lives also three Negroes
Haw Lucy & Morris with one trunk one chest one pair
brass candlesticks one bed cover of homespun one unfinished
bed quilt with one half of all my Hatching furniture,
one Bell Metal Shovel, with all the property her Grand
Mother has in possession to her and her heirs forever.
The Residue of my Estate I leave to the Discretion of
my trusty friend James Hays Dooper to sell and dispose
of as he sees fit to support and Educate my Children
whom I appoint as Executors over them.
In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
fixed my seal. this Ninth day of July Eighteen
hundred and One.
