State of North Carolina In the Name of God Amen, I Aron Tyson being of
Hyde County sound mind and memory blessed be God, but
in a low state of health do make and publish this my last will
and testament in manner following that is first I will that all my
just debts be paid out of the property hereafter mentioned,
I then lend to my well beloved wife Esther the plantation now known
during her natural life and further lend her all my horse, hogs, sheep
and cattle farming tools & household & kitchen furniture, And my wife
one negro woman Edy during her natural life & widowhood & further I will
tell my two children come as far or married one negro & I named Henry
son & boy named Jake. - Then I will that my executor sell all my lands
on Broad Creek either at public or private sale and such part of my
personal property as my wife shall print out to pay my debts.
Then I give to my two children, Sophy and Elizabeth, each all my lands
adjoining of William Jordan and these after their mother's death
and all personal property and perishable after their mother's death
to be equally divided between them Sophy to have the first choice of
the land and negroes to them and their heirs for ever. I nominate
and appoint William Jordan my executor to this my last will in
witness I have set my hand and seal this 30th of May 1815.

In the name of God Amen, I Richard Sadler one of the State of North Carolina and
County of Hyde being in full of mind and sound mind, and memory, do with
lawful intent and order this instrument in testifying my last will & I declare not
in manner of power following first of all it is my desire that my body should
be decently buried & immediately after my death in a Christian like
manner by my executor & as touching what it hath pleased God to bestow
with of this world's goods I give and dispose of in the following manner & it
is my desire that my executor should pay all my just debts & secondly I
give unto my son Nathaniel, Samuel and Richard Sadler each two cents
apiece 3rd I have unto my beloved wife Margaret Sadler all the rest
of my property as well in doors as out during her natural life or widow-
hood, after my just debts is paid, 4th I give unto my two sons
Annasias and Jacobiah Sadler all and singular my estate
except what is already disposed of after the death or widowhood of
their mother and my just debts is paid, 5th and lastly I nominate
Nathaniel and appoint my son Annasias Sadler my sole and
sole executor to this my last will and testament making and
disavowing all other will by me or for me made satisfying this to be
my last will. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and first my seal this 3rd day of April 1815.
