 I give unto my daughter Mary Three Dollars for the purpose of
 buying her a wheel. I give unto my daughter one bed & pillow
 in Revolution, all the Rest of my Cattle unto my wife Dorcas Rascoe
 all the Rest of my property I require to be Equally divided between
 my wife and four Children namely, Elizabeth, David and Mary
 Rascoe, it is my will and desire that my son David Rascoe
 should take care and give my wife Dorcas Rascoe a good
 education during her natural life and then to have that
 part of my property that I have bequeathed unto her &c &c.
 Lastly and all Provisionals and appoint my trusty friend
 William Harris Executor to this my Last will & Testament first
 proving and making void all other wills heretofore made by
 me or for me in testimony whereof I have set my hand
 and seal this Third Day of June 1806

In the name of God Amen I John Elbert being sick and weak of
 body but of sound disposing mind and memory thank debt at-
 tributed to God, and knowing the mortality of man and that it is ap-
 pointed for all men once to die, desire to make this my Last will
 and Testament in manner and form following first and prin-
 cipally I Recommend my soul into the hands of allmighty God who
 take it me and my body to be buried at the discretion of my friends
 hereafter mentioned. — Then I give and bequeath unto my well
 beloved son Ephraim Elbert all my property or Estate that I now
 possess except one Cow belonging to my mother Mary Ford, and one
 horse to my sister Eliza Elbert & her heirs first & chief of them
 I nominate Executors and appoint my trusty friend the said
 William Harris Executor of this my Last will & Testament Revoking all
 other wills or wills heretofore made allowing this only to be my
 Last will and Testament in testimony whereof I have set my hand
 and seal this 10th Day of March A.D. 1804 —

estate that it hath pleased G. to bless me with I give in
manner as followeth &c. - I Give and Bequeath unto
my beloved wife Mary Henderson my wife of the land
and plantation where we now live with all my farming
essentials house hold furniture of every Description within
Doors and without with all my stock of Cattle horses and
hogs and provisions on hand - and also I give unto my
wife the use of all my negroes untill my eldest son comes
of proper age there to be equally divided between my wife
and five children - I Give and bequeath unto my
son John Henderson one thousand acres of Land lying
on Swans Lane &c. - I Give unto my son James

Now there are hundred acres of land lying on Swan Island. ---
 Then I give and bequeath unto my son James Hutchinson one hundred
 acres of land lying on Swan Island. Then, I give and bequeath
 unto my Daughter Mary Hutchinson one hundred acres of land
 lying on Swan Island. Then, I give and bequeath unto my daughter
 Elizabeth Hutchinson one hundred acres of land lying on Swan Island.
 My will and desire is that my estate on the south side of the lake and
 my stock house at Middleboro shall be sold by my Executors at six
 months credit and all my out standing debts collected and paid
 as I owe. paid. Then the balance that I have left disposed off when
 my estate is settled to be equally divided between my wife &
 children and finally, I do nominate and appoint my well beloved
 wife Mary Hutchinson my whole and sole executrix to carry my last
 will and testament. Raising and confirming the same and
 drawing up and proving all and every other will or wills by
 me made and acknowledging this to be the only true will. In
 witness whereunto I set my hand and seal this 7th of May 1809
