 Testament. First I desire that my body be buried in decent Christian
 like manner and that what property I am now possessed of be
 disposed of in the following manner. I give to my Brother
 Benjamin Latham all of my lands to him this his forever.
 Then I give to my Brother Bryan & Brother William Latham my
 negro man & leg to be equally divided between them both.
 Then I wish my tools & bed to be sold and the profits arising
 to be equally divided between my Brothers, William
 & Bryan Latham. I hereby constitute & appoint Christopher
 Mallison & Seth Henry Esq. Executor to this my Last will
 & Testament. Whereunto I set my hand & seal this 25th
 day of December 1812

In the name of God Amen, I Benjamin Manderson of Hyde County in
 Province of North Carolina Being weak in body but sound in
 mind and memory thanks be to God for it do declare and make this to be
 my Last will and Testament in the presence of my friends following. viz
 to wit, First my wife and sister in law for recommending my soul to
 God who gave it me. That my body be decently buried at the discre-
 tion of my Executors here after mentioned, and all my just
 full and good debts paid and what few worldly goods I do
 possess to be divided on me & do leave and bequeath them in manner
 & form following. I give unto my Daughter Maria Manderson
 one Shilling Sterling and no more. I give unto my daughter
 Ruth Manderson one Shilling Sterling & no more. - I give unto
 my daughter Rachel Manderson one Shilling Sterling & no more. -
 Then I give unto my daughter Lewis Manderson my own wearing bed
 and all that belongs to it, six pointer plates & a choice of sugar dishes
 and her choice of any cow and calf that belongs to the pen and
 one Church bible & her and her heirs forever. I give unto
 my daughter, Michael Manderson one cow & calf and one bed-
 curtain used on next page

shedd and all the beds furniture Equally Divided between
 Michael & Lydia shore and share alike one Dove cot. Given
 to Michael Murdock to him and his heirs for ever and his and
 three plates. Item, I give unto my daughter Bridget one bed to
 her & her heirs for ever. Item, I give unto John Murdock one
 bed. Item, I give unto my son Benjamin Murdock one bed
 and all my tools to him & his heirs for ever. My land and
 plantation to be Equally Divided between Benjamin
 Murdock & John Murdock to them and their heirs for ever, share
 & share alike except that the two girls Lydia & Michael shall
 have their privileges as long as they live with out interruption
 by any body, I give unto Benjamin Murdock all my wearing
 clothes. Item, I give unto John Murdock one gun & bullet and
 one muntney, chest and a dock buckle. Item, the rest of my estate
 I desire should be Equally Divided passed & not sold betw-
 een Lydia Michael & Lydia. Item, Benjamin Murdock and
 John Murdock & if either of them die what belongs to that one to be
 Equally Divided between the other for ever. To them and their
 heirs for ever. My will and desire that my son Benjamin
 Murdock & Lydia Murdock should be Executors to this my will
 with and without and signed, sealed & subscribed for
 the same this 14th Day of August in the year of our Lord 1711
 Thousand seven hundred & Seventy six.

In the name of God Amen, I Benjamin Spencer of the County of Hyde &
 State of North Carolina being weak in body but of sound & disposing
 mind & memory. Thanks be to God Do make & ordain This my last
 will & testament in manner & form following - That to wit, I do
 bequeath unto my dearly beloved wife Elizabeth Spencer, all my estate
 within Doors without during her widowhood, except two beds and
 furniture and the cattle sheaves & hatched, buttermilk and Mary Spencer
 all the cattle that are now called hers and one bed & furniture & piece
 to quarter all & especially the residue of all my estate within Doors and
 without that may be remaining after the death of my wife Elizabeth
 to be Equally Divided between them the said Buttermilk & Mary
 Spencer share & share alike & in case either of my said daughter
 Buttermilk or Mary should die leaving no lawful issue of
 either of them by my will & desire is that all the property now in-
 tended to be given either of them should go to the other surviving
 and as for my other children Benjamin Spencer Samuel Spencer Sally
 Spencer, Elizabeth Sally & Lucretia Spencer these I utterly give and
 for ever of them into possession of all & every piece of property that is
 intended by me to be given them & Sally, to Lucretia & appoint my
 son Samuel Spencer my daughter Buttermilk Spencer, Sally &
 Elizabeth to be my Executors with full & sole power, to sell & convey
 this and no other, but Reserving all other by me made or intended to be
 made in witness whereof the said Benjamin Spencer doth
 Sign Seal & Execute this Convention 6th of May 1713
