In the Name of God Amen. I Charles Swindell in the County  
of Hyde & State of North Carolina planter being weak  
in Body but in perfect mind and memory do make &  
ordain this my Last my Last will & Testament this  
twentynight sixth day of Nov: 1790 In form following that  
is to say I give and Recomend my soul unto the hands  
of almighty God that giveth and my Body I Pre command  
to be decently interred at the Discretion of my  
Executor & touching such worldly Estate which it hath  
pleased god to bless me with I will and Bequeath in  
the following manner & form

I Bequeath to Elizabeth Swindell my wife the use of all England  
During her natural life I also give unto my foresaid wife one  
third part of all my personal Estate to be her Right & property  
for ever by her to be disposed of at her discretion and  
further my will & desire is that after the Death of my  
said wife that the thirty acres of Land held by her

from Thomas Gibbs shall be Equally Divided Between my  
two sons Christopher Swindell & Cason Swindell Then  
& their heirs or assigns By a line running along the said  
tract of Land perpendicular with the other line the rest of all  
my Lands then I Give & Bequeath unto my son Cason Swindell  
After the Death of my son said wife the Rite and title of  
all my Lands to him his heirs and assigns forever further  
my will and desire is that after my debts and Legacies is  
paid that the Remainder of my estate shall be Equally  
Divided Between my children Equally and further  
I do hereby nominate make and ordain William  
Harris junior Executor of this my Last will and Testament  
& I do hereby Disannul all other testaments and by me  
and this to be my Last will and Testament In witness  
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this  
day and date above written
