The mortality of this life and that it is appointed for all men
to die make this my Last will and testament in manner
and form following, viz, 1st I give and bequeath unto my
beloved Grandson William Thomas Adams Thos 2nd Regent of
Gine Court, Rem. it is my will and Desire that my son
John Adams shall have the use and profits of the said
negro untill my said grand son shall arrive at the age
of Eighteen years it is also my will and Desire that if my
aforesaid Grandson William Thomas Adams should die before he
is twenty one year of age that I give the aforesaid negro with
his Dower as if ady unto my son John Adams to him and his
heirs forever. But should my said son John Adams die before
my said Grandson William Thomas Adams, and my said
Grandson should die before he is twenty one year of age then
I give the aforesaid negro unto his brother or sister or mother
if any there and their heirs forever. 2nd I give Dine
unto my beloved son John Adams all the Rest of my negroes
all the remaining part of my estate both Real and Personal with all
money or notes which I myself maybe entitled to receive either
from my trust and P. 9. Routhack or else what is due to him
and his heirs forever. Lastly I do hereby nominate and
appoint my beloved son John Adams Executor to this my
Last will and testament, In witness where of I have set my
hand & fixed my seal this 21st day of November in the year
of our Lord 1807

In the name of God amen I David Davis of the County in the
State of North Carolina being of sound perfect mind & memory
I hereby avoid and revoke all former wills and testaments
I have made at any time & do now make, ordain and publish
this to be my Last will and testament in the following manner.
I give and bequeath unto my son John Davis the sum of
of all my right & my maker Beuchamp his most gracious
acceptance. I give that my body shall have a decent
Burial without pomp or any attending and that of my Executor
I give and bequeath unto my son John Davis, one negro by name of
George I also give unto my son John Davis one negro by name of Peter I also
give unto my son one negro woman by name of Kate I give and
bequeath unto my daughter Mary one negro woman by the name
of Dinah I also give unto my daughter one negro by name of
Moses I also give unto my daughter one negro girl by name of
Nancy. I give and bequeath unto my son John my Plantation that
I now live on one hundred acres more or less. I also give unto
my daughter Mary a certain piece of Land that I purchased of
the Hollander and a certain small piece that I purchased of Thomas
Honey joining the same Hollander Land. I also give unto my son
John Davis three hundred Dollars to buy him a negro girl. I
also give my negro Betty fifty acres of Land being in Long neck. I
also set her free the remaining part of her time, my will is
that after my decease I also appoint my son John Davis with
Thomas Honey to be Executors September the 16th 1809
