In witness whereof I give and Bequeath to my two sons Francis Warner John Warner the manner Plantation whereon I now live containing

Eighty two & one third acres of Land to them & their heirs forever

Item I lend unto my will beloved wife Dorcas Warner all my real estate in doors and without only what I take all hers after bequeath to my children - But my wife Dorcas Warner to have the use of said Legacies during her life

Item I give and bequeath to my two sons Jeremiah Warner & Samuel Warner all the Residue of my real estate that I have not given away after my wife Dorcas Warner decease to be Equally Divided between them by my Executors hereafter named. Item, I give and bequeath to my son Thomas Warner my hunting gun to him and his heirs forever. Lastly I constitute & appoint my brother in Law William Davis my Executor & my wife Dorcas Warner my co-executor to this my Last will and testament

I do make and ordain this my Last will and testament in following manner and form first of all I Recommend my soul into the hands of God that gave it and my body to be buried in a Christian like manner at the Discretion of my Executors hereafter named and as for my worldly Estate that it hath pleased God to bless me with I Dispose of in the following manner.

Item, I give and Bequeath to my daughter Anne Easter the manner Plantation whereon I now live with all my Land adjoining there unto as far as the main Road and my small shooting gun with all the Cattle that is in the bar neck Sallards fork & under bit the right & left and over square the right & ear to her and her heirs forever

Item, I give and Bequeath to my daughter Eliza Easter the remainder of my Land that lies in the east side of the main road one gun one cow & earling to her and her heirs forever

Item, I lend unto my beloved wife Peggy Easter the Plantation & Land whereon I now live with all the Improvements thereon with all the remainder of my Estate during her natural

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life to raise & school my children
 Then, I nominate and appoint my wife Peggy Easter my Executor
 my Brother Thomas Easter my Executor to this my last
 will and testament Ratifying and Confirming this to be
 my last will & testament. In witness whereof I have
 hereunto set my hand and seal this 30th Day of March 1804.

 Family of my intention and also I give her the Note
 of John Baylors given unto my uncle Henry Luby
 for me for the hire of land for this year to her and her
 heirs forever.

Then I give my Negro Paul unto my three sisters Fanny
 Lory and Rebecca Purcell and my will is that she be
 hired out and the Money he hires for shall be and Equal
 Divisions amongst the three sisters, three and three hire
 and assigns forever.

Then, I give unto my Mother in Law, Elizabeth Purcell
 all my house hold furniture that is now in the house
 to her and he hires forever for dispose of at her own
 will after my Death — and my will is that Henry Luby
 and Benjamin Purcell Jr by my Executor to this my
 last will and Testament as witnesses my hand and
 seal this 24th Day of March 1804.
