Item I desire that the next negrobild that the Negro French Servant have Should be given to my Beloved Daughter Martha McSwain if she alive to her and her heirs and assigns for ever.

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my Beloved Wife Elizabeth McSwain one third part of my Major Plantation During her Life or till her death and the Negroe French named hisiah and after death the Negroe French and his Incomes to be divided among his children except the Negroe child that is given to my Daughter Martha McSwain and if my Wife Elizabeth McSwain is with Child before my Death and dies Before after my Decease

for my Wife Elizabeth McSwain to give to the said Child out of the Income of the Said wch hisiah as much as an equal Part with the Rest of her three other Children and the French and Incomes to be Divided Equally among her Children, that she had by me) one feather Bed & Furniture & 13d Stand one Horse Bridle & Side Saddle one Linen Wheel & Hooling Wheel to my wife) and one Negroe fellow named Peter during her life or

Item I Give to my well Beloved Daughter Margaret McSwain one Bed & Furniture and the half Part of the Negroe fellow named Peter after my wife Marry to her and her for ever.

Item I Give and Bequeath to my well Beloved Daughter Ann McSwain one feather 13d & Furniture and the other half Part of the above mentioned Negroe Peter after my wife Elizabeth Marry to her and her Heirs & a Pigeon for ever.

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my Beloved Sons Edward McSwain and John McSwain one Piece of Land Lying on the West Side of Parley's Mill from Swamp containing six hundred acres of land more or less.

Item I Give & Bequeath unto my Beloved Son John McSwain one piece of a piece of Land Lying on the West Side containing fifty acres to him & his heirs & assigns for ever.

Item My Desire is that my Executors Should sell the House and two Lots and the Stock Should be Sold at Publick Auctione

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Elizabeth McSwain and Martha McSwain each of them one cow Half to them their Heirs & assigns for ever.

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my Beloved Sons Edward McSwain John McSwain Jacob McSwain each of them one Bed a piece

Item My Desire is that the other Cows Should Stay on my plantation where on I Reserve for the use of the said plantation orchards and all working Tools and the remainder part of my Estate that is not mentioned in this will to be Divided among my three Sons and my wife Except the Horse and they to be Divided among my three Sons Edw. McSwain John McSwain & Jack McSwain Lastly I Nominate and chuse to be my Executor and Will before I die Roger Ormond or my well Beloved Wife Elizabeth McSwain my Executrix of this my last will & Testament not Revoking all other Wills her to see by me made allowing of this only to be my Last Will and Testament I witness whereof the said Edward McSwain have hereunto set my hand and seal thereto this day of September 1772
