I give to Devise and Bequeath unto my Son Thomas Barrow the plantation where and now live and all my Lands and Tenements that I am now possessed with to him his heirs forever —
I give to my Beloved wife Mary Barrow 1 Bed & furniture her chair two Cows and Calves six pewter plates & 2 pewter Dishes 1 Walnut Table 1 chest 1 chair 1 Linen & wool Wheel
I give to my Son Thomas Barrow the my Negro Woman Harriet Salt and her child named Read 1 Bed & Furniture
I give my wife one Box Iron and Heater one Iron Pot & 2 pewter Basins, one Negro woman named Sarah — I her by Authority and empower my Exec^r here after mentioned to sell the Remainder of my Estate or so much thereof as will Discharge all my Debts and Expenses if there Remains any of my Estate should be left after my debts is paid I give the same to my Son Thomas Barrow and Lastly I appoint my friend John Satchwell and my wife George Barrow Exec^s to this my last will and Testament Resolving anything of I have here unto set my hand and Seal the Twenty Second Day of Aug. Anno Dom. 1788.

Item I send unto my loving wife Mary Ebom the whole of my Estate for the Term of fourteen years to raise and school my young Children without any charges against them —

Item then my will is that my Estate be Equally Divided Between my Loving Wife Mary Ebom and my Six Children Henry Ebom John Ebom, Ephraim Ebom, Willulona Ebom, Charity Ebom, Agnes Ebom them and their heirs forever — I acknowledge this to be my last Will and Testament hereby Revoking & annulling all former wills as Bequeaths by me made Acknowledge this only like my Last Will and Testament and my will is that there shall no advantage be taken but that everything shall go according to the true Intent & meaning of this my last Will — I leave my loving wife Mary Ebom and my Son Henry Ebom Executors to this my last Will and Testament In Witness where of I have here unto set my hand and Seal the Sixth day of January one thousand seven hundred and Eighty Nine
