

In the name of God amen — I George Bell being very weak & slow but in perfect mind and memory thank be to almighty God for it do make ordains constitute and appoint this be my last will and Testament revoking disavowing all other will or Wills by me made. First paying all Just debts against my Estate by Executors. Secondly I give unto my beloved wife Nancy Bell two feather Beds & the furniture that belongs to them also one iron pot two Linin wheels one Loom one Shuttle and one Dial pine. Christ and the use of my new dwelling plantation I give unto my wife Nancy Bell for the term of three years after my death likewise I give unto my wife Nancy Bell my hand mill for the term of three years. Thirdly I give & Bequeath unto my wife Nancy Bell two thirds of all my hogs. fourthly I give & Bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Bell one cow year old to be delivered to her at my death & likewise one wooden Wheel. Fifthly I give & Bequeath unto my son Jonathan Bell one cow & two year old. Sixthly I give and Bequeath unto my daughter Polly Bell one cow calf. Seventhly I give & Bequeath unto my daughter Mary Bell one live Lamb. Eighthly I give & Bequeath unto my youngest son Uriah Bell one live. Ninthly I give my Riding horse unto my wife Nancy Bell for the term of three years for the use of the plantation except he is obliged to be sold to pay my debts. Then I give & Bequeath unto my wife Nancy Bell one Bar plough two hoes one blubar and two pair of Chards and one Case knives and forks and three blivis & six spars. Tenthly I give & Bequeath unto my good Grand sons Littleton Bell & Edward Bell the sons of my son Littleton Bell the Remaining part of my Land that is not already sold or given away that came By my wife Mary Bell excepting the three year land to my wife Nancy Bell to them to be Equally divided. Eleventhly I give unto my wife Nancy Bell a Negro man called Peter during her natural life or widowhood for the use of raising my small children. Twelfthly I give one third of my hogs unto my daughter Elizabeth Bell they and thier increase — I give unto my son

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Littleton Bell one Shilling and no more — I give & Bequeath unto my son Jonathan Bell one Shilling and no more — I give & Bequeath unto my son Cornelius Bell one Shilling and no more. Thirteenthly I give & Bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Bell one feather Bed — All the Residue of my Estate that is not already given away I will that it be Equally divided between my son Walter Bell & Eleanor Bell & my daughter Dorcas Bell & Elizabeth Bell also the Lands that to my wife Nancy Bell after the term is out will be the same to be Equally divided between my son Watson Bell and Eleanor Bell & my daughter Dorcas Bell and Elizabeth Bell. Lastly I appoint my son Watson Bell & Eleanor Bell Executors to this my Last will & Testament to see that it is fulfilled according to the true sense & meaning thereof.
