I George Duke of the County of Hyde County and the State of North Carolina do acknowledge that this be my last Will and Testament revoking all other Wills or Testaments and that this be my last will and Testament either Verball or Instrument first of all giving my Soul to God and Body to the clay to be buried in a decent manner the Description of my Executive

First of all I give and Bequeath unto my Grand son John Williams English Inheritance to him and his heirs forever

Secondly I give and Bequeath unto my Grand son Duke H. Williams one fourth part of it to him and his Heirs forever

After and Bequeath unto my Daughter Phammy King my best Brother Bed and Furniture to her and her Heirs forever the sum of £ 1000 and Bequeath unto my Grand Son Martin H. Williams £ 1000 a little half Stock to him and his Heirs forever

Ninthly and Lastly I give and Bequeath unto my third Daughter Ann H. Williams Sarah Banks and Phammy King all my Whole Estate Real and personal to be Equally divided betwix them three Daughters before mentioned to them and their Heirs forever

Peter McWilliams and Moses Banks Executors to it humbly I set hand and Seal

April 6th Day one thousand Seven hundred and Eighty eight
In the Name of God Amen, calling to mind that it is appointed for all persons to die being sick and very weak in Body but in perfect mind and memory thanks be to God for it. I make Ordain and Establish this to be my last Will and Testament in name and manner following giving and Bequeath unto my Son Solomon Row, for the Bed

I give and Bequeath unto my daughter Mary Anne Row one Large Maple Table all the Residue of my Goods and Chattels both within doors and without that is not already given away I give and Bequeath unto my son Solomon Row and my Daughter Mary Anne Row to bring them up and raise them and Educate them upon as far as property will reasonable allow and after they all broke up and Educated if any thing to be left to be Equally divided between my Three Children William Duke, John H. Row, Daniel Row, Solomon Row and Mary Anne Row - Lastly I appoint my Trusty Friend John Cleves & my Daughter Tabitha Row my whole and Sole Executrix to see that my will is fulfilled and complied with according to the true intent and meaning of this my last Will and Testament as Witness I have hereunto set my hand and Seal day and date above
