Item I Give to my Daughter Asarah Bell one hundred year old Heffer.  
Item I Give to my Daughter Mary Slade one hundred year old Heffer.  
Item I Give to my Daughter Keziah Peter one hundred year old.  
Item I Give to my Daughter Mary Slade one hundred year old.  
Item I Give to my Daughter Lydia Leith all the rest of my <sup>upright</sup> ~~own~~  
Item I Give to my Daughter Lydia Leith one pair of shute and  
one pair of Blankets. Item I Give what I have not already  
willed I Give to my Son Samson Leith and Daughter Keziah  
Peter to be Equally Div<sup>id</sup> between themselves and my  
will is that my Son Samson Leith to be my Exec<sup>utor</sup>  
and my Daughter Lydia Leith to be my Exec<sup>utrix</sup> in  
Witness where of I have hereunto set my Hand & seal  
this first Day of July Seventeen hundred and  
Seventy seven.

General Resurrection I shall Receive the same again by the mighty power of  
God and touching such worldly Estate as it hath pleased God to Bless me  
in this world, I Give and Dispose in form and manner of form following  
Item I Give and Bequest to my Son A Bner Spring the Plantation that I now  
live on also one hundred and ninety five acres of land that she brings to my son  
John Spring Item I Give in the Rest of my Estate to my loving wife  
during her widowhood to Raise and School my young Children and  
then after my wife's widowhood the rest of my whole Estate to be  
Equally Divided among my six Children that is John Spring  
Moses Spring and Let of all I do constitute and appoint my  
loving wife Elizabeth Spring Aaron Spring James Spring  
to be my Exec<sup>utors</sup> to this my Last will & Testament in writing  
in Witness where of I have hereunto set my Hand and seal  
this tenth Day of December one thousand seven hundred  
Eighty and one.
