 I now live on with my horses and Tools to work the ground
 with I give her a third of all the Ground with one third
 of the Housing and the land Ground during her widow hood
 her my Household goods during her natural widow hood
 After my Son John Peter Slade the Plantation I now live on
 with one hundred acres of Land during his widow hood since he
 taking in the Plantation likewise Negro boy named Moses if
 left or to Enjoy them if not to be Equally Divided between his two
 Sister Susannah & Agnes Slade
 I give to my daughter Susannah Slade Twenty five acres Land
 when John Macomber at the Southeast End of my Patent Likewise
 give her one Negroe wench named Dinah if she likes to Enjoy them if not
 to be Equally Divided between her Brother and Sister John & Agnes also
 I give to my daughter Agnes Slade Twenty five Acres of Land lying
 between John and Susannah Slade Land all three pieces to come
 out to the road I give to Agnes Slade one negro man named John if
 she likes to Enjoy him if not to be Equally Divided Between John
 & Susannah Slade I give to Major Macking the Land lying
 betwixt the Road and the Head of Shute Creek so along my
 Patent line to conclude all the land that was will by my
 Grandfather to my father -
 I also give to Sarah Mackings one Brothers Bed and one covered
 half one Cow and Lamb and their increase also one Horse & Cattle
 Prune also give her Furniture for her Bed & constitute and ordain
 them as Executors the sole Ex: Hzechiah Slade Test:

In the Name of God Amen, I John Slade of the State of
 North Carolina and County of Hyle Being infirm in
 Body but in sound and disposing mind and memory do
 make and ordain this my last will and Testament in forme
 Following that is to say, I Give and Recommend my Soul
 into the hands of Almighty God who gave it and my Body
 I recommend to the Earth to be decently interred at the discretion
 of my Executors and Touching such worldly Estates as it hath
 been Pleased God to Endow me with I will and Bequeath
 in the following manner and Form.

I give and Bequeath to my son Thomas Clayton one half of my
 Land lying at the Eastward end of the Lake during the his life
 this over part of it sales Give to him One Brother Bed and Furniture
 one Cow and Calf and the increase of them and one Bay chest

Item I give and Bequeath to my Son Eliot Clayton one half of my Land
 above mentioned, one Brother Bed and Furniture one Cow and
 and the increase of them and one Bay chest and Give to him Thomas
 Clayton one Man and his increase to be Equally divided between

Item I give and Bequeath to my Beloved wife Jane Mal Clayton, all
 my Land aforesaid and the Plantation thereon during her
 widow hood. I give to her all my stock of cattle which are not
 disposed of already. During her natural life I like wise give
 to her all and Singular my Household Goods Next of every
