for the same calling unto mind the mortality of my body
& knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die I do make
& ordain this my last will and testament Roting and
disannulling all other former testaments with Legacies &c
Relieving & confirming this and no other to be my last will
and testament and not touching my worldly Estate where with
it hath pleased God to bless me within this Life I dispose
of in the following manner & form following
Item I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Elnor Swindell all my
Real Estate of Land and morables and the profits
issuing therefrom during her Life or surviving of my
said wife to pay the following Legacies to the Children when
they come to Lawfull age
Item I leave to my son Isaac Swindell one hundred acres of
Land between Jacob Daniels and Joseph Swindells and one
feather bed
Item I leave to my son William Swindell two thirds of an hundred
acres of Land lying on the other side of the Lake by the
name of Lewis Bay point and one feather bed
Item I leave to my three sons Joel Swindell and Silas

and I wish Swindell one certain piece or parcel of
Land Lying between William Burner & Thomas
Thornthorne to be Equally Divided between them the said
Silie and I wish Swindell at their coming of age and also
one further bed apiece to my said three sons Joel Silie
& I wish at their coming of age.
I leave to my Daughter Bethany Swindell one feather
bed and bedsted and one cow & calf.

I then also the Remains of my moveable Estate after my wife's
Death to be Equally divided among all my sons & Daughters
I also constitute and appoint my wife Eliza Swindell
and Isaac Swindell Executors to this my last will &
testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and seal this sixteenth day of March one thousand
seven hundred & ninety three (1793)

State of N^o Carolina In the Name of God amen I Enock Ebom
Hyde County Being sick and weak of body and knowing the
certainty of Death desire to make this my last will and testament
first I Recommend my soul into the hands of God who gave it
me and my body to be decently buried at the Discretion of
my Executors hereafter mentioned and as to what worldly Estate
as it hath pleased God to bestow on me I Dispose of in man-
ner and form following. — I'mprimis — I desire all my debts
funeral & pious to be fully contracted and paid. I do order that
these negroes should not be sold out of this family of my father —
I give and bequeath to my well beloved Brother Hosea Ebom
two hundred and twenty acres of land to him and his heirs for ever —
I give to Ann Ebom to James Ebom and Margaret Ebom and to
Philip Ebom & to Hosea Ebom and to Moses Ebom and all
my worldly goods I have not mentioned and negroes to be
Equally Divided among them and the Rest of my Estate that I
posses now or ever shall of my fathers Estate or mine to them
& their heirs for ever. I do constitute and appoint my William
Ebom & Hosea Ebom Exors. of this my last will & testament
and I do hereby revoke all other wills & wills heretofore made I do
hereby publicly declare this to be my last will and testament
In witness whereof I have set my hand and seal this 13 day of April 1799.
