 Rea be Executor to this my Last Will & Testament.

In the Name of God Amen, Isaac Wilkinson of the County of Hyde
 in the province of North Carolina being in perfect health do make
 and ordain this my last will and testament in form following
 that is to say Give and Recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty
 God that gave it and my Body to be Buried in the Earth to be so buried at the
 discretion of my Executors and touching such worldly Estate which
 it hath pleased God to bless me with I Will and Bequeath in
 the following manner & form I Give and bequeath unto my son
 Jacob Wilkinson two hundred acres of Land lying in the forks of Broad
 Creek & Spout which I Bought of John Sorkin, I Give to my son
 Jacob Wilkinson fifty Acres of more or less lying to Markers Land on
 Broad Creek which Land I Bought of Geo Duke. I Give and Bequeath
 unto my son Jacob Wilkinson two hundred Acres of Land which I Bought
 of William Webster lying on the North side of Pamlico and Spungo Rivers.

I Give and bequeath to my son Jacob Wilkinson two negro fellows
 named Jack and Jack one feather Bed and Turniture, I Give and
 bequeath to my wife Elizabeth Wilkinson the plantation where on I resided
 with all privileges on the said Land during it's widowhood or life
 with Liberty of the Privileges of Rale timber to support the
 plantation from Jacks creek with the privileges of Croatures
 Goying the said Jacks creek, I Give and Bequeath to my son
 Isaac Wilkinson all the Land down in Jacks creek, after my death
 with a negro fellow named Sud with a Boy named Mark.

I Give and Bequeath to my son Isaac Wilkinson the plantation where on
 I now live after the death of his mother or at her marriage. I Give
 to my son Isaac Wilkinson one feather Bed and Turniture

I Give and Bequeath to my son Aaron Wilkinson all the Land
 which I own on Albano Creek on the South side of Pamlico
 with a Negro Girl named Bridget and a Negro Boy named Dan and another
 negro Boy named Rump with a feather Bed and Turniture,

I Give and Bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Salter two hundred
 Acres of Land lying on Rump Swamp which I Bought of
 a negro fellow named Sam and a negro girl named Vicki and
 a negro Boy named Mary, I Give to my wife Elizabeth
 Wilkinson during her widowhood or life a Negro fellow Peter with a
 negro wench named Mimmy and a negro wench named
 Hannah and a negro wench named Jude and a Negro
 carried over

girl named Ruth with a third part of my Cattle, Hogg, sheep
and all household furniture Excepting my Gunns, Steel traps, carpenter
& cooper Tools which I desire to Equally divided Between my
three sons Isaac Jacob & Aaron. Item I leave to these friends in
hand money for the schooling of my son Aaron & likewise
I desire that if any of my Estate be sold it may be Equally
divided amongst my children that ~~is~~ if sold by way of
Debt and I desire that neither my three sons Isaac Jacob &
Aaron may have the privilege of selling Land or negroes until
they are thirty years of Age. Item I desire that if any of
my children die without Heir that the Estate I give them may
be Equally divided amongst the Rest of my children.

Item I bequeath to my son Isaac Jacob and Aaron and Daughter
Elizabeth all the Estate with the increase of my wife Elizabeth Wilkinson
all the Estate with the increase of my wife Elizabeth Wilkinson
During her widow hood or life to be Equally divided amongst
them. Item I likewise constitute and appoint my well
beloved wife Executrix and also my son Isaac Executor of
this my last will and Testament and I do hereby utterly
disallow revoke and Disannull all and every other former Testament
In witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this fourth
Day of December in the Year of our Lord one Thousand seven
Hundred and seventy Eight.

In the Name of God Amen, The thirtieth of March and in the Year
of our Lord one thousand seven Hundred and Eighty, William Gibbs
of the County of Hyde and in the State of North Carolina being wrought in Body
but of perfect mind and memory Bless be God, I thus free calling to mind
the mortality of my Body and that it is appointed for all men to die, do hereby
ordain this my Last will and Testament that is to say, I give fully first of all
I give and bequeath my soul to the hands of God that gave it and my Body
I recommend to the Earth to be Buried in a decent Christian burial at the
Discretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned not doubting but at the
General Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty
Power of Almighty God and attaching such worldly Estate whereunto it
hath pleased God to bless me with in this Life, I give and Dispose in the
same in the manner and form following. First I give and bequeath to my eldest
son William Gibbs two Hundred acres of Land where on he now lives
and upwards and one negro fellow named as Isaac and two thirds of the Cattle
that runs at his one pen, Item I give and bequeath to my son Silby Gibbs one
half of the Land I now live on. Item I give and bequeath to my son
Jeremiah Gibbs the Southward half of the Land I now live on.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Benjamin Gibbs that Land where on the
widow Jennett now lives and one negro Boy called George one feather Bed
and furniture and one young mare and three cows and calves.

Item I give and bequeath to son Tho^s Gibbs one negro gill called Nam
and one hundred and fifty Pounds for Gold and Silver and three cows
and calves and further to my will and desire that he shall be put to
school when he comes to the age of ten years and kept to school
till he is fifteen years old out of my Estate and further it
my will and desire he shall then be Bound to a trade other
Gold Smith or a Tiler. Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary
Spencer one negro woman named Rose and one negro Boy named
Robert and one hundred pounds in State money. Item I give
and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Gibbs one negro gill called
Ester and one feather Bed and furniture and three cows and
calves and one hundred Pounds. Item I give and bequeath to my
Daughter Sarah Gibbs one negro gill called Tamer and one hundred
and fifty pounds and three cows and calves and one hundred
Pounds. Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Anne Gibbs
one negro gill called Darker and one feather Bed and
furniture and three cows and calves and one hundred Pounds
earned over
