

In the name of God am I, Jacob Canner Being very sick and weak of body but of sound disposing mind and memory thanks be to God for the same. Do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner & form following that is to say first I give my soul to God that gave it me and my body to be buried at the Discretion of my Executors hereafter named and what worldly estate it hath pleased God to bless me with I devise in manner & form following Infirmity, I send to my loving wife Nancy Canner the use of the plantation where and now live till my own Jacob Canner comes to the age of twenty one year and if she should marry only one third and after the said Jacob Canner my son comes of age or she should marry only one third of said plantation for life. I also send my wife Nancy Canner the use of a negro man named Lister to raise my young children and leave him at the Discretion of my Executors to continue him on the plantation or hire him out as they may think best for the support of my family and one young horse for the support of my family to be continued on the plantation.

- Item I give unto my beloved wife Nancy Canner one table one pine chest one pane glass one iron pot & two covers one bed & furniture to her & her heirs for ever.
- Item I give and bequeath to my son Jacob Canner two hundred acres of Land Being the manner plantation where on I now live and one hundred acres in a new survey adjoining of Sinclair & Swank and give one feather bed & furniture one large iron pot and one negro man named Lister one Beaupat to him & his heirs for ever.
- Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Nancy Canner two hundred and seventy five acres of Land known by the name of Lark's old field one bed & furniture and iron pot to her & her heirs & assigns for ever.
- Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Canner seventy five acres of Land Lying in sections and one half of a negro boy named James one feather bed & furniture and

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iron pot to her and her heirs and assigns for ever.

- Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Morning Canner one negro girl named Edna one feather bed & furniture one iron pot & her heirs for ever.

- Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Nancy Canner two hundred and one Acre to her & her heirs for ever, also all the property that I have not given away already my desire is that should be equally divided between my wife Nancy Canner my son Jacob Canner and my three daughters Nancy Canner Mary Canner & Morning Canner, nine years from the date of these presents the division to be made. Also my will and desire is that my wife Nancy Canner have the use of all my estate for the term of nine years after, to raise & school my children upon and if my Executors hereafter named should think that she the said Nancy use the same with prudence if not, the two Executors to take such part from her and school them agreeable to the income of the estate.

Lastly I constitute and appoint my loving wife Nancy Canner my Executors & Jacob Wilkins & John Wilkins & my son Jacob Canner my Executors to this my last Will and testament Revoking Disannulling & Disallowing all former wills by me made ratifying & confirming this to be & containing this my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 12th day of May 1800 & in the 24th year of the said Independence signed sealed published & pronounced by the testator as his last will and testament in presence of us
