

The Last will and Testament of M^r. James Cleaves after
 Recommending my soul to God who gave it me and my body to be
 Buried in a Christian like manner in the name of God, I make
 this my last will and Testament. I bequeath unto my beloved wife
 Lydia Cleaves during her natural life my house and plantation
 I would will an Care of all incumbrances.

Item I give unto my wife one Horse Bridle and Saddle and two or three
 beds & furniture and all my Tables and one Desk and all the
 Cattle that are in my proper name and also one half of my
 Potions and two head of Sheep now Running on prings Creek
 and three sows and five head of small hogs which are
 at the upper end of my plantation all these for her to
 Dispose of at her will and pleasure.

Item I give unto my Daughter Elizabeth Cleaves all my Cattle that
 is in her care and is an Record to be and her hire for ever
 and all the remaining part of my personal Property here
 to be sold to the best advantage. I say all that part that is not
 will'd away. I leave one negro man named Love for the use
 of my Daughter Elizabeth Cleaves to be Disposed of by my executors
 for the Education and maintenance of her as they think proper
 and if the Negro should misbehave he or is to sell him and
 purchase another for the same use.

Item I give unto my Daughter Elizabeth Cleaves my land Lying
 in Smiths Creek that I purchased of George Casper to her
 and her heirs forever. First it is the favor of my Executor
 to make over a Deed to the heirs of William Wade deceased a
 piece of Land Lying up in Hillin Creek and also have a
 small piece more joining the same to be sold by my executors
 to the best advantage or as they think proper. I leave my wife
 Lydia Cleaves and my Brother John Cleaves Executors to this
 my Last will in Witness whereof I have unto set my hand
 and seal this 10th day of January 1785

 Hyde County of the State and County aforesaid being
 sick but of a sound & perfect mind and memory blessed be
 God do this thirteenth day of December in the year of our Lord
 one thousand seven hundred and ninety four do make
 and publish this my last will and Testament in
 manner following that is to say

First I give and bequeath to my Daughter Margaret Smith
 Collins one hundred acres of Land willed to me by my
 husband Henry Collins one Deed one braupat two fire stoves
 & furniture and one Liron Silver Tea spoons & silver tongs
 one Christ my will and desire is that the above mentioned
 articles may not be sold but to be kept by her firm till
 she arrives to the age of Eighteen years old

Second I give and bequeath to my Daughter Margaret Smith Collins
 all the rest of my Estate Consisting of Household furniture
 of every kind and all my stock of Cattle hogs and hams &c.
 to her and her heirs forever Lawfully begotten of her body
 and if she should die without and I live or be full heir
 then my will is that James barrow should have one bed
 and furniture one Table and one Christ and all the rest
 of my property I leave to Thomas Wilkins to him and his heirs
 forever

Lastly I hereby make and ordain my worthy friends
 Thomas Wilkins and Ben. Forman my Executors
