

State of North Carolina J. J. Jarvis being weak of Body but of  
 Hyde County sound & disposing mind and memory, do  
 this day make and ordain this my last will and testament  
 in the following manner & form that is to say Principally  
 and First of all I give unto my beloved wife Sarah Jarvis  
 my manner of plantation during her natural life or widow-  
 hood I also give unto my wife all movable property both within  
 in Dorris and without during her natural life or widowhood  
 then after the death or marriage of my wife I give unto my son  
 Reading Jarvis my manner plantation with all the lands ap-  
 pertaining thereto to him and his heirs for ever. Also five  
 acres of land in the Cypress Swamp to him his heirs for ever  
 then I give unto my son John Jarvis one hundred & eighty acres  
 of land at well Creek on Juniper Bay also five acres of land  
 in the Cypress Swamp to him and his heirs for ever. then  
 I give unto my son George Jarvis one hundred acres of land in  
 Coar County at the head of Messers Creek on Bay River to him and  
 his heirs forever. then I give unto my daughter Devina Jarvis my  
 negro woman Hannah to her & her heirs for ever. then  
 after the death or marriage of my wife I will that all my movable  
 property be Equally divided between my four children Reading  
 Jarvis, John Jarvis George Jarvis & Devina Jarvis. I also make  
 no movable bequests and appoint my most beloved wife and  
 Samuel Jarvis the sole executor & executrix of this my last will and  
 testament. Ratifying & confirming this and no other to be my  
 last will & testament. Signed sealed & acknowledged this  
 18<sup>th</sup> Day of October 1807 — in presence of  
 and in presence of each other *Jose Jarvis Seal*

In the name of God Amen, I Robert Winfield of Pamlico and Hyde  
 County in the State of North Carolina being infirm in body but in  
 perfect health do make and ordain this my last will and testament  
 in order following, that is to say I give & Recommend my soul into  
 the hands of almighty God that gave it and my body I recommend  
 to the earth to be decently Entombed at the Discretion of my Executors  
 and touching such worldly estate which it hath pleased God to bestow  
 me with I will and bequeath in following manner & form.  
 I Bequeath to my beloved Children all my Estate of lands that were  
 the head of the Dunnoy Creek to my two eldest Children named Zach-  
 ariah Winfield and Hiram Winfield and all the lands of mine on  
 Pamlico to my beloved three Children named Samudra, John and  
 William Winfield to be Equally Divided Between them and the said  
 Lands and Plantations to be left to my beloved wife Abigail during  
 her life, and also for her to have the two negroes named Kate  
 & Bessie to help and Raise the three Children above named & Devina  
 then to have the two named negroes Kate & Bessie to be after her death  
 to be divided share and share alike between my five Children as above  
 named, and all the Rest of my estate to be left at the Discretion of my  
 two Executors named Bay and Winfield & Thomas Jordan, and I do  
 hereby utterly disallow revoke and disannul all and every other former  
 testament and will by me in any ways before named written and  
 Bequeathed Ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last  
 will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my  
 hand & Seal this 8<sup>th</sup> day of February 1808.
