

State of North Carolina May 17th day 1794

Hyde County I John Linton of God Linn in John Abrams son of Hyde County being weak of body but of sound mind and memory make this my Last will and Testament in manner and form following first to all I recommend my soul into the hands of God that gave it.

Item I give and bequeath to my well beloved son Robert Abrams a certain parcel of land containing sixty four acres lying and being in the hands of his dividing brother John my son William Abrams now live at our son and give to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my son James Simpson a certain parcel of land containing fifty acres being parts of the land whereon I now live, likewise four French hams three cows and pigs and three hams to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give to my daughter Elizabeth Abrams one English shilling or the value thereof in currency.

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Sarah Abrams three French hams and two Spanish milled dollars and two shillings but silver and two Burrey bags of bed and furniture.

Item I give to my son William Abrams one shilling sterling or the value thereof in currency.

Item I give and bequeath to my son John Abrams one English shilling or the value thereof in currency.

Notice I leave our man and two year old horse and many other household articles to be sold at the discretion of my executors to pay my debts and funeral expenses and if any money over my desire is it shall be equally divided between my son Robert Abrams and my son James Simpson and my daughter Sarah Abrams to them and their heirs forever. I do constitute and appoint to this my Last will and Testament my well beloved son Robert Abrams to be my executor to act and do for me after my death.

This third day of November in the year of our Lord 1794, I John Linton of Hyde County Being very sick and weak of body but of sound mind and memory for which I thank God & calling the mortality of my body and knowing that it appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last will and Testament and principally and first of all I give and bequeath my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it me and as for my body I recommend that the ground to be buried in a Christian like & decent manner and as for such worldly goods or estate that it hath been please God to bless me with in this life I give and dispose of the same in manner and form following

First I will and bequeath to my wife Elizabeth Linton twenty dollars.

I give and bequeath to my son Nathaniel Linton twenty dollars.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Burridge Linton twenty dollars.

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Nancy Linton twenty dollars.

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Barbara Linton Twenty dollars.

Item I give and bequeath to my son John Linton Twenty dollars.

Item I give to my daughter Barbara Linton Twenty dollars now, I desire that the legacy money be paid to my children as they am to age then I desire that my three cows and calves at mathermost be sold for the use of my
